PASTORAL REFLECTION & WEEKLY OFFERTORY RECAP

FROM THE DESK OF OUR ADMINISTRATOR

My dear friends in Christ, as we journey through this Advent season, let us reflect on the transformative power of hope in our lives. These are challenging times. Our political climate has polarized us, leaving many questioning whether our systems truly serve the common good. Disagreements often escalate to anger or hatred, deepening divisions even within the Church itself. Have mercy, oh Lord! Do we see the one who sits next to us in the pew as our brother or sister in Christ, or do we see only their political labels and social status? We must remember that, regardless of our differences, we are all brothers and sisters in Christ. Though let's admit it, some of our spiritual siblings can really test our patience!

Let's be honest – the holiday season can feel like navigating a minefield or a quicksand. Between work stress, family expectations, the perfect gift or the ideal Instagram post and endless to-do lists, it's easy to lose sight of the true meaning of this sacred time. Yet Preparedness is essential. It's like carrying a Swiss Army knife that helps you handle whatever comes your way.

So here's a tough question: Am I truly willing to prepare a way for God in my life and in our community here at St. Anthony's? Are we ready to make space for Him, not just in our hearts but in our tangible actions? Saint Paul's prayer for the believers in Philippi challenges us to consider how we can grow in love for those around us, asking God to increase our capacity for compassion. Is love in the air? Is it overflowing?

The prophet Baruch speaks a message of consolation and hope, promising that God will come to free us from sadness and pain. In these turbulent times, we are all yearning for comfort: "for God is leading Israel (and us) in joy by the light of his glory, with his mercy and justice for company."

I know that many of you are carrying heavy burdens that feel impossible. Health challenges, financial stress, or relationships that seem beyond repair. The holidays can amplify or worsen these struggles, leaving us desperately searching for peace.

But here is the truth: You are not alone. We all need comfort. Comfort is about finding peace in the midst of chaos. John the Baptist calls out, "Prepare the way of the Lord," reminding us that true comfort is on its way. Jesus, the Divine Comforter, is with us every step of the journey.

Reflecting on our inner landscape, let's talk about those valleys and mountains we all have and that require leveling. The valleys are those parts of ourselves we know need work like patience, kindness, and gentleness. The mountains are stubborn habits we need let go of pride, envy, partiality, resentment, selfishness, that quick tendency to judge and condemn others.

Think of this Advent season, my friends, like a personal retreat. It's about facing the uncomfortable and ugly truths we usually avoid. Remember, true discovery and grow begin within ourselves, and even in the emptiness or chaos we may encounter, God is present. Will we trust Him to guide us through the wilderness?

When you pray, don't overthink it. Just be authentic, humble and honest. Something like, "God, I'm struggling. Help me. Increase my faith," or "Oh God, have mercy on me, a sinner." These prayers bring peace and inner joy. God's judgment is rooted in infinite love. Do we believe that, even when our hearts condemn us?

Salvation comes with Jesus, bringing radical transformation. He makes us new. Paul's prayer in the second reading offers guidance for this Advent season, urging us to broaden our perspective beyond our personal struggles and pay attention to those around us.

As we embrace Advent, let us renew our imagination and ask: What is God doing in my life right now? Let us open our hearts, just as we are, and joyfully welcome the Lord. Maranatha! Come, Lord Jesus, come! We're ready. Amen.

SACRAMENTS & MINISTRY INFO

ACTIVE PARISHIONER

The criteria for an Active Parishioner are:

-Weekly participation in worship through attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.

-Volunteer at St. Anthony's on regular basis (**Time**)
-Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**)
-Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving
(**Treasure**)

PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for <u>at least six months</u> prior to reception of these

Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility.

Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre- registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.
