SACRAMENTS & MINISTRY INFO

ACTIVE PARISHIONER

The criteria for an Active Parishioner are:

-Weekly participation in worship through attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.

-Volunteer at St. Anthony's on regular basis (**Time**)
-Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**)
-Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving
(**Treasure**)

PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for <u>at least six months</u> prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility.

Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre-registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

SPIRITUAL LIFE

FROM THE DESK OF OUR ADMINISTRATOR Fr. Emerson Rodriquez Delqado

Ever feel like there's got to be more to life than this? Like you were made for something bigger, something that lasts forever? You're not alone. Deep down, we all have this longing for eternity.

We try to fill that longing in different ways. Poets write about how fast life goes by. Artists pour their souls into creating something that will outlast them. Parents find purpose in their children, hoping to live on through them. But that desire for something more never really goes away, does it? It's always there, like a quiet whisper in our hearts. Some people chase after youth, thinking that's the answer. They fear getting older, clinging to their younger years. Others chase after possessions, hoping to find satisfaction in stuff. But deep down, don't we all long for a life of true significance? A life that satisfies our deepest desires and lasts forever?

This is where Jesus speaks directly to our hearts. He calls himself "the bread of life." Just like bread nourishes our bodies, Jesus offers to nourish our souls with something eternal. He promises to satisfy the deepest longings of our hearts, filling that emptiness that nothing else can seem to touch.

The Gospel invites us to pursue this "food that endures to eternal life." It's not about escaping reality, but about discovering a whole new dimension to life. It's about building our lives on a love that's stronger than death, finding our purpose in loving God and loving others.

Here's the amazing part: John's Gospel tells us that eternal life isn't something we have to wait for. It's a gift we can receive right now through faith. And when we open our hearts to that gift, everything changes. We stop chasing after fleeting things like youth or possessions and start investing in what truly matters. We find a purpose that goes beyond ourselves, a hope that anchors us in the present moment.

Of course, this doesn't mean life becomes easy. We still face challenges and heartbreak. But with this eternal perspective, we can face those trials with courage and resilience. We know that our true hope lies in something bigger than ourselves.

So, that longing for eternity we all feel? It's a signpost, pointing us towards our Creator. It's a reminder that we were made for more than just this life. In Jesus, we find the answer to that longing. He offers us a relationship that satisfies our deepest hungers and lasts forever.

As St. Paul reminds us, embracing this eternal life means letting go of our old selves and embracing the new life Jesus offers. It's a life of righteousness, holiness, and true purpose. So, I ask you: what are you chasing after in your life? How are you trying to satisfy that longing for eternity? Maybe it's time to consider the invitation Jesus offers – to embrace a life that's truly full and eternally significant, starting right here, right now.

Save the Date - Popsicles on the Playground and Back to School Blessing


