PASTORAL REFLECTION & WEEKLY OFFERTORY RECAP

FROM THE DESK OF OUR ADMINISTRATOR

Fr. Emerson Rodriguez Delgado

My dear friends, have you ever thought about reading a book by starting with its final chapter? Odd, right? Yet, here we are, at the beginning of the Church year, diving straight into the end of the world. Perhaps this unconventional beginning invites us to reimagine our perspective on faith, life, and hope.

Pope Benedict XVI offers us an intriguing insight: Faith isn't just about reaching a destination; it's about the journey itself. When planning a road trip, we usually set our GPS to know the destination. Would you ever start driving without knowing where you're headed? Probably not! The destination influences everything—the route, the stops, the luggage, even the snacks. But what if the true meaning of life lies not in where we are going, but in who accompanies us on the journey?

This shifts our focus from the endpoint to our companionship with Christ, who guides our path, much like the disciples on the road to Emmaus. Like pilgrims on the road to Emmaus, our path is defined by transformative encounters. Christ walks beside us, often unrecognized yet persistently present. Aren't we traveling this Emmaus road?

Walter Brueggemann reveals a profound truth: Hope is an act of rebellion. When life overwhelms us, hope becomes our most potent and radical force. It's active resistance against chaos and despair. This hope in Christ transforms death into life, sin into grace, and the cross into forgiveness.

Moreover, we aren't just waiting for something to happen; we are waiting to meet someone—Christ. He is not an abstract idea, but a living, risen presence who desires to transform both us and the world. Teilhard de Chardin believed that the entire universe is evolving towards an "Omega Point," God's endpoint where all will be united in Christ. Each moment of our lives is a step towards this union in Christ.

When Jesus admonished us, "Stay awake," he wasn't encouraging sleeplessness. He was inviting us to be fully present, to live each moment intentionally, aware of God's incarnated presence in everyone we meet. As Teilhard de Chardin observed it, "We are spiritual beings having a human experience." If we truly lived each moment as a spiritual encounter, how would our lives change?

Peruvian theologian Gustavo Gutierrez challenges us to see Christ in our daily interactions—in the stranger's kindness, a friend's concern, a spouse's care, or the silent presence of a fellow parishioner. These moments become windows into God's sacred reality, where His presence manifests in the ordinary. These are transformative encounters—liminal moments where God's epiphany is everywhere.

When we speak of "end times", we're not invoking fear but celebrating liberation and creation's perfection. Teilhard de Chardin envisioned humanity evolving toward higher consciousness, united in Christ's love. His metaphor of "discovering fire for the second time" suggests humanity's spiritual awakening to Christ's transformative love.

This vision calls us to embrace a journey of transformation, filled with radical hope and the promise of extraordinary possibility in Christ. Can we recognize the sacred in the everyday and participate in creation's journey toward its fulfillment in God's all encompassing love?

Let us unleash the power of radical hope in the ever-present Christ, the Omega Point of all creation, as everything is united in Him and through Him. By embracing this vision, we open ourselves to a transformative journey, one filled with hope, love, and the promise of something extraordinary on the horizon. Are we ready to begin this journey anew? Maranatha. Come, Lord Jesus.

SACRAMENTS & MINISTRY INFO

ACTIVE PARISHIONER

The criteria for an Active Parishioner are:

-Weekly participation in worship through attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.

-Volunteer at St. Anthony's on regular basis (**Time**)
-Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**)
-Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving
(**Treasure**)

PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for <u>at least six months</u> prior to reception of these

Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility.

Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre- registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.
