

SACRAMENTS & MINISTRY INFO

ACTIVE PARISHIONER

The criteria for an Active Parishioner are:

-Weekly participation in worship through attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.

-Volunteer at St. Anthony's on regular basis (**Time**) -Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**) -Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (**Treasure**)

PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for <u>at least six months</u> prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility.

Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Preregistration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

SPIRITUAL LIFE

FROM THE DESK OF OUR ADMINISTRATOR Fr. Emerson Rodriguez Delgado

Dear friends, listen up! Rabindranath Tagore nailed it when he wrote, "Faith is the bird that feels the light and sings when the dawn is still dark." In these tumultuous times, does this resonate with you? Here is the thing: faith isn't just about holding on when the path is lit up like the Fourth of July; it's about having the audacity to sing your heart out and to find joy even amidst the deepest shadows of uncertainty. Can we, too, find the courage to be that voice of comfort, that melody of hope for someone who's struggling? Amen!

This Sunday's scripture paints a vivid picture of the contrast between the privileged and the marginalized – a reflection of the dichotomy of our society. Jesus takes stand against of those who use religion as a cloak for their personal glory—a danger not just to themselves, but to everyone around them. Isn't it troubling to see religion, which should be bringing us together and healing our wounds, twisted into a tool for creating division and puffing up egos? Lord, have mercy! Often, today's leaders are synonymous with power and status. But let's get real: Are we in this game to grab more for ourselves, or are we here to give our all to lift up others? Have we lost sight of what leadership is really about – serving and empowering others?

Picture this: on one side, the scribes, engaged in the dangerous dance of the narcissistic spiritual peacocks, hungering for power and status. On the other, the scandalous acts of generosity of the two widows that shake us to the core. One widow prepares to share her last meal with a stranger, while the other offers her last coins with humble generosity. Their actions reveal the true meaning of giving – stemming from deep love for God and neighbor. Why is that those with the least often give the most? What does that say about our own hearts when we cling tightly to our stuff?

Cardinal Ratzinger, who became Pope Benedict XVI, identified three powerful forces that drive human behavior: hunger, love, and power. He warned that worshipping these forces instead of God lead us down a dangerous path. The scribes, supposedly teachers of God's law, are too busy trying to elevate themselves.

The widows' actions challenge us to step outside of our cozy bubbles, to open our hearts to those who are struggling, and to expose any hypocrisy we may harbor. Do we have the guts to take a long and hard look in the mirror? Their example reminds us that true generosity flows from the solidary heart, not from a craving for likes and shares. A gift given grudgingly bears no worth, whereas a gift given with love and sacrifice, no matter how small, is truly priceless.

So, what does it mean to live out this kind of faith? What prevents us from completely surrendering to God? Is it fear? Is it attachment to material possessions or the illusion of security they offer? Friends, radical generosity and solidarity pave the way to liberation, both for ourselves and for those we serve. It demands a paradigm shift—perceiving the world through the lens of the poor and humble, recognizing that giving ourselves should be as natural as breathing.

Here's the twist—the ones who embody this kind of faith are everyday folks, just like you and me, who choose to live with extraordinary kindness. What if the secret to true happiness is in giving more of ourselves rather than trying to get more? Through Christ, our acts of giving turn into an endless source of abundance. Just look at those mighty widows!

As we venture out into the world, I challenge each of you: Where can you be that song of hope, that shining light in someone's stormy journey? In the shadows that shroud our world, how can we join the symphony that lifts people up and inspires them? The choice is yours, amigos. Will you embrace the life-changing magic of selfless love and radical generosity? After all, YOLO, am I right? Let's go out there and make it count for God's Kingdom!




