

SACRAMENTS & MINISTRY INFO

ACTIVE PARISHIONER

The criteria for an Active Parishioner are:

-Weekly participation in worship through attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.

-Volunteer at St. Anthony's on regular basis (**Time**)
-Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**)
-Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving
(**Treasure**)

PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for <u>at least six months</u> prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility.

Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre-registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

SPIRITUAL LIFE

FROM THE DESK OF OUR ADMINISTRATOR Fr. Emerson Rodriguez Delgado

Friends, let's dive into the mysterious and sacred journey of marriage – not just the fancy wedding day, but the real adventure that starts way long before the "I do's" and carries on far beyond. It's easy to look at marriage as the culmination of love – the end point of the path of falling in love. But the truth is, marriage is only the beginning. Love remains and deepens, but its form changes, renewing itself in a different, more profound way.

Remember Adam and Eve? God didn't just give Adam a buddy to hang out with. No, He created a deep, intimate soul-level connection between man and woman. This is the essence of marriage: a bond that transcends the physical and reaches into the very depths of the spiritual.

Now ponder your own relationships. Are they just surface-level, or do they touch your heart? Jesus challenged us to love our partners as complete equals. In a world where people often treat relationships like they're disposable coffee cups, how can we uphold this call of lasting commitment?

You see, marriage isn't a fairy tale ending. It's the start of an adventure with ups and downs, laughter and tears. It's about choosing to love your partner each and every day, even when it's tough.

The ancient readers of the creation Bible stories didn't take them literally. They saw them as profound metaphors for the journey we all must take toward wholeness and deep connection and lifelong commitment.

Think about those everyday moments with your spouse - making coffee together, saying goodbye in the morning. We often overlook these little things, but aren't they the bedrock foundation upon which an enduring relationship is built?

Remember when your partner simply listened after you had a bad day, without trying to fix everything? Or a moment when you messed up, but they forgave you without keeping score? That's the kind of love Jesus talked about - not just words, but tangible, life-giving actions.

Real marriage isn't about looking perfect on social media feeds that makes everyone green with envy. It's about loving your partner even when they annoy you - like leaving dirty dishes around or snoring loudly, even when they leave their socks on the floor or forget to put the toilet seat down. How often have you had to swallow your pride, bite your tongue, and choose love anyway? More than you can count, I bet.

So how can we infuse our daily lives with more of this sacrificial, Christ-like love? Perhaps it starts with being fully present when our loved ones are sharing their hearts, instead of absently nodding while our eyes are glued to our screens. Maybe it means finally releasing that grudge we've harbored for far too long and extending genuine forgiveness.

What one small act of love can you do today? How can you make your spouse or your child or your friend feel truly seen, heard, and valued? For when we live with love like this - in our homes, our neighborhoods, our church - we have the power to change the world around us. This is how we can truly live out our faith and our calling - by loving extravagantly, sacrificially, and unceasingly. Amen.


