

# **SACRAMENTS & MINISTRY INFO**

## **ACTIVE PARISHIONER**

The criteria for an Active Parishioner are:

-Weekly participation in worship through attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.

-Volunteer at St. Anthony's on regular basis (**Time**) -Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**) -Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (**Treasure**)

## PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for <u>at least six months</u> prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility.

#### Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Preregistration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

#### **First Holy Communion**

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

#### Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

#### Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

#### Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

# SPIRITUAL LIFE

### FROM THE DESK OF OUR ADMINISTRATOR Fr. Emerson Rodriguez Delgado

This Sunday, my friends, we're faced with a striking paradox that challenges us to explore the very core of our faith and humanity.

Get this scene: Jesus is pouring his heart out, sharing the ultimate sacrifice he's about to make for all of us. And his closest friends? What are they doing? They're too busy arguing about who's the most important, like kids fighting over the last cookie. Can you believe that?

But hold up, before we judge them too harshly, let's take a hard look in the mirror. How many times have we found ourselves in the same situation?

Sure, we all have dreams and ambitions. Right? that promotion, a bigger pay check, giving our families the best. Nothing wrong with that.

But here's the thing: our Gospel shines a spotlight on what's truly driving us. Are we just power-hungry, money-grubbing, recognition-seeking missiles in human form? Are we okay with stepping on others to get ahead, even in our church or volunteer work? Or maybe we're hiding behind a facade of good deeds to make ourselves look better?

It's like the apostle James said: where there's jealousy and selfish ambition, there's chaos and every kind of evil. The disciples' petty argument is a shocking reminder that even good people can fall for the trap of pride, power, and greed.

So, let's get real with ourselves for a moment. When was the last time your faith set your soul on fire? Have you tried lately to get closer to God, to help someone in need without hesitation, or to be a better person even when life throws punches? As St. Augustine said, "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you."

These questions, though maybe a little uncomfortable, make us face the difference between what we say we want and what our hearts really desire.

Think about this: what if we chased after our faith with the same passion we chase promotions, good sales or hobbies. What if we chased after righteousness like it was the last lifeboat on a sinking ship?

That is the kind of ambition that can transform lives and shake the very foundations of this world.

Remember how Jesus embraced that child and said, "Whoever welcomes one of these little ones in my name, welcomes me"? He's unveiling a revolutionary path to greatness—one paved with humility, selfless service, vulnerability, and boundless love. So, let's have the courage to realign our ambitions. Let's pour our hearts into building God's eternal kingdom, not our fleeting, self-serving kingdoms that will crumble like sand castles in the tide.

May God bless us with the unquenchable fire to pursue him above all else, guiding toward true greatness and goodness. Let's learn from the disciples' mistake and let our actions reflect the selfless and sacrificial love of Jesus Christ. Can I get a hallelujah?


