

SACRAMENTS & MINISTRY INFO

ACTIVE PARISHIONER

The criteria for an Active Parishioner are:

-Weekly participation in worship through attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.

-Volunteer at St. Anthony's on regular basis (**Time**)
-Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**)
-Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving
(**Treasure**)

PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for <u>at least six months</u> prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility.

Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre-registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

This season also offers a great opportunity for **spiritual**, **moral and faith renewal** as we prepare to enter into the passion, death, and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. So, can you slow down to reconsider the path you are taking, to find the way that leads you home, and to rediscover your profound relationship with God, on whom everything depends.

Let us remember that **the fruitfulness** of the Season of Lent is not just about **the little sacrifice** we make,

but **it is about discerning** where our hearts and life are directed. This is the **core of Lent**.

I wish you all a very meaningful and fruitful Season of Lent.

There will be a change of time to Fridays' Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament as we will begin the Stations of the Cross. **The Stations of the Cross** will continue through **Friday, March 29, 2024,** and the time for the **Stations of the Cross** will be held at **6:00 PM**.

Therefore, from **Friday, February 16, 2024**, through **Friday, March 22, 2024**, the **Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament** will be held at **9:45 AM – 10:45 AM**, and from **12:00 Noon – 5:00 PM**. There will be no Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on Good Friday, March 29, 2024.




