SACRAMENTS & MINISTRY INFO

ACTIVE PARISHIONER

The criteria for an Active Parishioner are:

- Weekly participation in worship through attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.
- Volunteer at St. Anthony's on regular basis (**Time**)
- Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**)
- Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (**Treasure**)

PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for **at least six months** prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility.

Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre-registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

SPIRITUAL LIFE

FROM THE DESK OF OUR PRIEST IN RESIDENCE

Fr. Emerson Rodriguez Delgado

Our Sunday gospel passage from John 15:1-8, where Jesus refers to himself as the vine and his followers as the branches, has deep relevance to our present-day circumstances.

In today's fast-paced world, we often find ourselves striving for individual success and self-sufficiency. It's all about the "I" and less about the "we." But this passage serves as a wake-up call. It tells us that, just like branches can't bear fruit if cut off from the vine, we can't truly thrive if we isolate ourselves from others and from God. Especially in these challenging times, when our world is hit with crises and hardships, it is our unity and mutual support that make us resilient.

Moreover, the passage's focus on remaining in Jesus and bearing fruit is a direct call to action for us. It encourages us to transform our faith into tangible actions by serving others, advocating for justice, and protecting our shared environment. Today, we're confronted with massive challenges such as social inequality, racism, poverty, and climate change. These are not issues that can be swept under the rug. Instead, this passage insists that we, as a community, must respond proactively and engage wholeheartedly.

In the end, my dear friends, this passage reminds us that losing touch with Jesus can lead to significant challenges. Our relationship with God, much like any friendship, can weaken or even break. Being part of him is about unity and community. Consequently, how we recognize and treat our neighbors becomes exceedingly important.

Let's take a moment to reflect on the aspects of our spiritual life that are facing struggles. What requires some pruning or letting go in order to facilitate our spiritual growth? Remember that the finest wine is produced from grapes that have weathered tough conditions without becoming detached from the vine. Likewise, by maintaining a strong connection with Jesus, we're given the strength to spread enduring love and goodness in our lives and throughout our community.

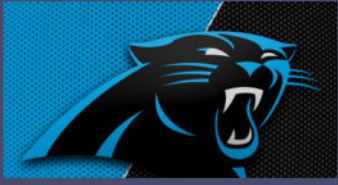

PRINCIPAL'S PURVIEW

For the next few weeks I want to share a bit about our School Advisory Council in the *Purview*. I know sometimes there are questions about who assists the pastor and principal as the voices of the community to be sure we are staying true to our school & parish mission. That's where the School Advisory Council (SAC) comes in! SAC is formed and guided by by-laws set forth by the Diocese of Charleston, which can sometimes be adapted (with approval from the Bishop and Superintendent of Schools) to fit the needs of each school community.

The by-laws outline the following for each schools' advisory council: purpose & function, membership, meeting requirements, officers, committees, and ethical obligations & conflicts of interest. Each monthly meeting of SAC operates on a standard agenda consisting of prayer, review of minutes from previous meeting, committee reports, principal & pastor reports.
