#### **BULLETIN CONTENT SUBMISSION**

Anyone parish group/organization wishing to submit items for publishing in the weekly bulletin should send the content to Kyle Hall (<a href="mailto:kyle.hall@charlestondiocese.org">kyle.hall@charlestondiocese.org</a>) by end of day Tuesday for the coming weekend's bulletin. Submissions may have to be edited due to space constraints.

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony *must be registered members for at least six months* prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility.

#### **Infant Baptism Class for Parents**

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Preregistration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

#### **First Holy Communion**

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

#### Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like

to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

#### Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

#### Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

## PASTORAL REFLECTION

#### FROM THE DESK OF OUR ADMINISTRATOR

#### **Love Your Enemies**

My friends, this Sunday, Jesus calls us to move beyond the familiar "golden rule" of treating others as we wish to be treated. Instead, He invites us to embrace something higher, harder, and more transformative: to love our enemies.

Is it even possible? Radical? At first glance, it might seem so. How can we love someone who has hurt us, betrayed us, or treated us unfairly? Yet, this command is rooted in the very nature of God, who "is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked." Jesus urges us, "Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful." Why? Because we are called to imitate our Father, who makes His sun rise on both the good and the bad. Just as God transcends justice with mercy, so too are we called to do the same. It's a hard teaching. It goes against the grain of our pride, selfish desires, and natural instincts.

When Jesus talks about love, He's not referring to a warm, sentimental feeling. He speaks of agape—a love that demands action. Agape is a love that does good, even to those who oppose or harm us. Ouch! That's not easy to hear, is it?

In the New Testament, agape refers to doing good even for those who tear us down. This kind of love is not about loving someone in the hope that they'll return the favor. It's not rooted in sentiment but in the will—a deliberate choice to do good, to say good, and to pray for our enemies. These three concrete actions are the guideposts Jesus gives us to live out this love.

Let's be honest, though. Loving others doesn't mean allowing ourselves to be abused or mistaking passivity for meekness. Jesus Himself showed us what love looks like in the face of injustice. When a soldier struck Him, He didn't sink into passivity or rage. Instead, He responded with courage and truth, saying: "If I have spoken wrongly, testify to the wrong. But if I have spoken rightly, why do you strike me?" (Jn 18:23). What about us? When someone wrongs us, how do we respond? Do we fight? Do we flee? Or do we take the harder, more transformative path—the path of love? Jesus shows us that love isn't weak. It's a force for justice, peace, and transformation. Alleluia!

Jesus met violence with reason and truth, not retaliation. You see, the enemy doesn't want to see your face or hear your voice. They want to dehumanize you, to reduce you to an object. Why? Because it's easier to harm an object than a person. But Jesus calls us to resist. By responding with love, we hold onto our humanity and invite our enemies to rediscover theirs. We open a door for their transformation. What if our love could turn things around?

Here's the truth Jesus leaves us with: "For the measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you." How we treat others—especially our enemies—determines how we will be treated. If we give mercy, mercy will come back to us. If we sow love, we will reap a harvest of love. But if we sow hatred, revenge, gossip, or bitterness, we'll be consumed by the very darkness we unleash.

Let me give you a striking image. Think of the jellyfish, the Medusa, found in the Bay of Naples. When this jellyfish swallows a nudibranch snail, it draws it into its digestive tract. The snail then slowly begins to devour the jellyfish from the inside out. By the time the snail is fully grown, it has consumed the entire jellyfish.

My dear friends, that's what happens to us when we harbor revenge, hatred, and bitterness. They devour us from the inside out. They steal our joy. They poison our souls. They leave us empty and broken. But the love Jesus calls us to is different. It frees us. It heals us. It pulls us out of darkness and into light.

At the end of the day, the choice is ours. We decide how we respond to our enemies. Will we choose hatred? Or will we choose love? The ball is in your court, my friends. Choose wisely—for eternity. Because love never fails. Amen.

The students assembled in the gymnasium and, when prompted, presented information about their historical figures to the audience.



#### HELP WANTED

#### The MICAH Program is seeking volunteers to be Mentors

#### What is the MICAH Program?

We are a lay ministry recognized by Bishop Fabre-Jeune and St. Anthony's.

Our mission is to help people in our community with poor credit secure a low interest loan (~4.3%). We refer to people seeking a loan from the MICAH Program as Neighbors.

In South Carolina, financial companies can charge people with poor credit extremely high interest rates. The loans typically range in the 150% and higher range! A 12 month loan for \$1,000 from a predatory lender can cost >\$980 versus our low cost loan costing ~\$24!

#### What does a Mentor do?

- 1. Help Neighbors with loan application
- 2. Recommend Neighbor for Loan
- 3. Accompany Neighbor to Loan Closing
- 4. Monthly check-ins with Neighbors

#### What sort of time commitment is it?

Steps 1 to 3 take between 4 to 8 hours spread across two to three weeks.

Step 4 typically takes 15 minutes a month and is done via texts, emails, phone calls or face to face.

#### What skills do I need?

- 1. Compassion and empathy toward the Neighbor
- 2. Basic personal finance skills
- 3. Listening skills

#### How do I sign up?


