PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for <u>at least six months</u> prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility. **To register, please email Kyle Hall at kyle.hall@charlestondiocese.org**, or you can also <u>register</u> <u>online</u> - scan the QR code below by opening your camera app.



Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre- registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

PRAYER

FROM THE DESK OF OUR PASTORAL ADMINISTRATOR

Hey friends, let me ask you something: what would you do if you only had five minutes left to say everything you've ever wanted to say? Picture the chaos. Phones ringing. Notifications buzzing. Social media melting down with frantic calls or messages, all carrying the same urgent words: "I love you." In those final moments, you'd let go everything else – your to-do list, your worries, even your pride – to connect with those who matter most. You'd try to cram a lifetime of gratitude, care, and affection into just a few rushed sentences. But here's the deeper question: why wait until the clock's about to run out? Why keep the most meaningful part of life locked away until the end? Humans are funny, aren't we? When we are confronted with the reality of death, the distractions of life suddenly fade. The stress, the arguments, the endless chasing after worldly goals—they all fall away. What rises to the surface is love. Simple, pure, essential.

Love is what we crave, what we need, what ultimately gives life its meaning. So, if love is that important, why don't we make it our priority now, while there's still time? Life is fleeting—tick, tock. Every moment is a chance to connect, to care, and to choose love.

At its heart, our Christian life is about one thing: love. That's it. Simple to say, but not always easy to live. Yet, what does it truly mean to love? We toss the word around like confetti: "I love coffee," "I love tacos," "I love my family." It's so overused that its meaning sometimes feels watered down. But the love Jesus calls us to reaches far deeper. The New Testament describes it as agape—a love that is selfless. Sacrificial. Unconditional. It's a choice. It's a deliberate action. A decision to prioritize others – especially when it's inconvenient or difficult. It means giving of yourself, even when you're tired or frustrated, would rather not.

Here is the thing: love isn't just something you do—it's who you are. At your very core, you were created by God in love and for love. Your identity is defined by it. God Himself is love – a constant, infinite, outpouring of connection and self-giving. And if we're made in His image, then love isn't simply an action we're called to. It's who we're designed to be.

Now, let's be honest – choosing love is hard. Forgiveness? Tough. Patience? Even harder. Loving someone who gets under your skin? That's a challenge. It's difficult to choose love when you're resentful, angry, or overwhelmed. Maybe it's the little things – a spouse's annoying habit or rude stranger, a co-worker who's just too much. Or maybe it's the big things – resentment, road rage, or judging someone who is different from you. But here's the good news: love is always there, waiting for you to choose it. No matter the circumstance or challenge. As Paul reminds us in 1 Cor 13: 'If I have all faith, so as to move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing."

In today's world, where technology and algorithms attempt to define what matters—our relationships, emotions, even our priorities—it's easy to lose sight of real connection. But love isn't a trending hashtag or a "like." It's so much more. Love is sacrifice. It's stepping away from distractions to be fully present. It's sitting with someone who's struggling and saying: "You matter." And here is the real question: will we let AI redefine what it means to love and connection? Or will we reclaim love as the force that shapes who we are and how we live?

This Sunday, Jesus gives us one of the most profound challenges: "As I have loved you, so you also should love one another." It's a selfless, unconditional, and transformative. It's the kind of love that heals broken hearts, tears down barriers, and creates something entirely new. In the Book of Revelation, we're given a sneak peek of this love power: "a new heaven and a new earth," a world all things are made new. Can you Imagine it? A world where love is the foundation. Where walls crumble, wounds are mended, and hope flourishes. That's God's vision of love in action – a reflection of His abundant love for us. Scripture reminds us, "We love because He first loved us."

So, why wait? Think about the moments in your life that truly matter. Were they about money? Achievements? Possessions? Or were they about connection – about the people you cared for and the love you shared? At the end of the day, we'll only regret the love we held back, the words we didn't say, the hugs we avoided, the opportunities to give that we let pass by.

Don't wait. Love today. Love deeply. Love like Jesus. Love boldly and generously, because love is the one thing you can give away and never run out of.

Let's make it our mission - not tomorrow, not someday, but now. Let's live it, breathe it and share it. Let's start today, St. Anthony family. Let's choose love. Because in the end, love is what will outlast everything else. Amen.


