PARISH REGISTRATION & SACRAMENTS

ACTIVE PARISHONER

- Weekly attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.
- Volunteer on regular basis (**Time**)
- Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (Talent)
- Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (Treasure)

PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for **at least six months** prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility. **To register, please email Kyle Hall at kyle.hall@charlestondiocese.org**, or you can also <u>register online</u> – scan the QR code below by opening your camera app.



Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre- registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

PRAYER

FROM THE DESK OF OUR PASTORAL ADMINISTRATOR

This Sunday's Gospel offers us a profound and beautiful paradox—one that both comforts and challenges. Jesus says, "Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid. I am going away, and I will come back to you." At first glance, these words may seem contradictory. How can Jesus' departure lead to a deeper connection with him? And yet, isn't it often in moments of absence or loss that we discover a surprising closeness to what truly matters?

Life is full of these head-scratching moments—times when absence somehow deepens connection. How might Jesus' words invite us to rethink what it means to be in relationship with him and the Father? Through the Holy Spirit, Jesus transcends time and space, dwelling in every moment and every heart that welcomes him. And honestly, isn't this exactly the reassurance we need right now?

We live in a world that feels so fractured—divided, uncertain, and often consumed by the need to be "right." This mindset leaves little room for the Spirit to move. When we cling to certainty, we lose the humility that faith requires. We stop listening—truly listening—and overlook God's work in our lives and in the lives of others. Certainty can harden our hearts, closing them to the Spirit's quiet movements and blinding us to the wisdom God may be offering through someone else.

So, let me ask: When was the last time you truly listened to someone you disagreed with—not to argue, but to understand? When was the last time you set aside your need to be right and instead chose to love? The Spirit invites us to release the false divisions that break our world apart. How often do we pit the spiritual against the physical, reason against faith, or morality against creativity? But God created the world to be whole, not fractured. Can I get an Amen?

As Teilhard de Chardin reminds us, "The same Spirit that is the source of the law of gravity is also the source of the law of love." Translation? The Holy Spirit isn't confined to what we label as "spiritual" matters—it animates all of life. From the smallest particle of creation to the grandest act of kindness, the Spirit transforms tensions into opportunities for growth, grace, and maybe even a little humor along the way. And honestly, we need that, too.

In a rapidly changing world, this message becomes even more urgent. Cultural diversity, technological advances, and shifting norms can feel overwhelming. Yet the Spirit invites us to embrace this complexity with faith, hope, and love. It's in that messy tension between what is and what could be that God's transformative power is most alive.

The Spirit calls us forward—toward the "new Jerusalem," a vision of harmony, joy, and fulfillment. But this isn't just a distant hope. Each time we listen instead of argue, bridge a divide instead of deepening it, or choose love over fear, we catch a glimpse of this promised reality. In those moments, we become co-creators with the Spirit, bringing God's vision to life here and now.

So, what's your next move? Will you listen to someone you don't see eye to eye with? Will you choose humility over the need to have the last word? Together, let's take these steps of love and faith, trusting that we are already beginning to build the "new Jerusalem" in our midst, here at St. Anthony's.

Amen.
