

PARISH REGISTRATION & SACRAMENTS

ACTIVE PARISHONER

- Weekly attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.
- Volunteer on regular basis (**Time**)
- Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**)
- Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (Treasure)

PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for **at least six months** prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility. **To register, please email Kyle Hall at kyle.hall@charlestondiocese.org**, or you can also <u>register online</u> – scan the QR code below by opening your camera app.



Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre- registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

PRAYER

FROM THE DESK OF OUR PASTORAL ADMINISTRATOR

If Jesus scrolled through the highlight reel of your life, would He find a follower—or just an admirer? Admiration comes easily. We admire Jesus' teachings, His miracles, and His sacrifice. But admiration? That's the safe option. It cost us nothing. It doesn't demand change, stretch us, or pull us out of our comfort zones.

Following, though? That's a whole different ball game. Consider how we interact with social media. We "like" posts, follow accounts, and scroll endlessly, consuming what entertains or inspires us. But it is passive. No commitment required. When something no longer serves us, we simply unfollow and move on. Isn't it tempting to treat our relationship with Jesus the same way?

We're all fans when it's easy—when the message feels uplifting, when it fits neatly into our schedules (a quick drive-thru Mass, if possible), and when the cost is low. We'll share an Instagram-worthy Bible verse or post a prayer that gets a dozen likes. But what happens when Jesus asks for more? When following Him requires sacrifice, discomfort, and perseverance? Would you stay? What if following Jesus means committing to a church community that doesn't perfectly fit your preferences? What if it means staying present during messy conflict or crisis, rather than walking away? What if it means saying "yes" to Him, even when the path ahead feels steep, dark, and costly?

Faith isn't about convenience, sorry. It's about commitment and transformation. It's about saying "yes" to Jesus when it's hard - when it stretches us beyond what we think we can bear. Peter's story reminds us of this. Peter doubted. He failed. And yet, Jesus didn't call him because he was perfect. He called him because he was willing. There's hope for the rest of us yet! Alleluia!

After Jesus' death, Peter returned to what felt safe and familiar—fishing. Maybe he felt unworthy. Maybe he thought he had failed beyond repair. But Jesus didn't leave him there. How often do we feel like Peter - casting our nets into our careers, our relationships, our plans, or our communities—only to come up empty? How often do we carry the weight of failure, asking, 'What's next, Lord? And just like with Peter, Jesus shows up.

On the shore, after a fruitless night of fishing, Jesus calls out: "Cast your net on the other side." The result? Overflowing nets. It's a moment of recognition: it's Jesus. Exhausted and overwhelmed, Peter doesn't wait for the boat to reach shore – he jumps into the water, desperate to reach Him.

And there, on the shore, Jesus has prepared breakfast over a charcoal fire. That detail? It's no coincidence. The last time Peter stood by a charcoal fire, he denied Jesus. Now, at this fire, Peter stands before the One he failed. But instead of judgment, there's grace. Instead of shame, there's a mission. Jesus doesn't ask, "Why did you fail me?" He doesn't demand an explanation. Instead, He asks one piercing question: "Do you love me?"

Three times, Jesus asks. Three times, Peter responds. Each question peels back the layers of Peter's heart. But here is the thing: Jesus isn't reopening wounds to shame Peter—He's healing them. He's replacing Peter's shame with grace. He is transforming Peter's failure into strength and his brokenness into a renewed purpose: "Feed my sheep."

What's powerful is how Jesus meets Peter where he is. Peter's love feels inadequate. When Jesus first asks if Peter loves Him with "agape" love—selfless, unconditional, sacrificial love—Peter can only offer "phileo" love, a brotherly affection. It feels small, inadequate. Twice, Peter offers what seems like less than enough. But then Jesus does something extraordinary: He meets Peter where he is. On the third question, Jesus shifts. "Do you have phileo love for me?" Jesus takes Peter's incomplete, imperfect love and declares it enough.

Jesus doesn't demand perfect love. He doesn't demand flawless faith. He takes what we can give—our messy, faltering, inconsistent love—and transforms it, He calls us to shepherd others with the same heart of the Good Shepherd, with agape love.

So today, Jesus asks you the same question He asked Peter: "Do you love me?" in your life, in your family, in your community of St. Anthony - tend His sheep.

The question is, will you drop everything and dive in, like Peter did? Or will you stay in the boat, waiting for the perfect moment that may never come? The choice is yours. How will you respond?

PRAY FOR OUR MILITARY

Did you know...

- We gave out 3,114 bags of food in April that's an average of 173 bags every day!
- We're open Monday-Thursday, 9 AM to 1 PM, serving anyone in need.
- We partner with Harvest Hope to help stock our shelves.
- We receive frozen meat donations from Publix three times a week.
- We have an incredible team of 51 volunteers including 4 who grocery shop to keep up with growing demand.
- 12 dedicated men pick up the Publix donations each week.
- Last week, we hosted a cookout with burgers and hotdogs for our neighbors and homeless friends.
- We provide personal hygiene bags every week for those experiencing homelessness.
- We depend on your donations each week to keep this ministry going strong.
- Most importantly, we take great pride in serving our community with love and care.


