PARISH REGISTRATION & SACRAMENTS

ACTIVE PARISHONER

- Weekly attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.
- Volunteer on regular basis (**Time**)
- Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (Talent)
- Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (Treasure)

PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for **at least six months** prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility. **To register, please email Kyle Hall at kyle.hall@charlestondiocese.org**, or you can also <u>register online</u> – scan the QR code below by opening your camera app.



Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre- registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

PRAYER

FROM THE DESK OF OUR PASTORAL ADMINISTRATOR

What stories define your life? We live in a world powered by stories. Scroll through your social media feed, listen to a podcast—it's all about stories. Stories of love that endured, sacrifices that changed lives, victories against all odds, or heartbreaks that taught resilience. They shape who we are, how we see the world, and what we value. They remind us of where we've been and guide us toward where we're going.

But for Christians, one story rises above all others: the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. It's not just a story—it's the story. The story that proclaims the ultimate truth: Death is not the end. Life is stronger. Love is victorious. The Resurrection is the living, breathing heartbeat of everything we are and the foundation of all hope.

The story begins simply: a shared meal at a table, the breaking of bread. It moves through the breaking of Christ's body on the cross, into the silence of a sealed tomb. And then, it erupts—into an unimaginable, unstoppable joy on Easter morning. The tomb is empty. Jesus lives. And in that moment, everything changes.

Picture that first Easter morning. Mary Magdalene, heartbroken and searching stands in the garden. The scent of blossoms fills the air, the first light streaking across the sky. She is lost, grieving, full of questions. And then, she hears it: Her name. "Mary." In that one word, spoken by the risen Savior, her entire identity is restored. She turns—and there He is. Alive. Hope, like sunlight, floods her heart. That moment didn't just transform Mary's life—it transformed the entire world.

But here's the thing: Easter isn't just a day to celebrate or a story to retell. It's a call to action. It's an invitation to step out of the tombs that trap ustombs of fear, anxiety, sin, despair, comparison, bitterness, resentment – and step into the light of new life and freedom.

Let's be honest—living in the light of the Resurrection isn't easy. It takes courage because it goes against what we see trending in our feeds and what the world often tells us to believe. When life feels broken and hope feels distant, we can doubt. But remember the angels' words to the women at the tomb: "Why do you look for the living among the dead?" so let me ask you: where are you looking for hope? Are you so focused on what's broken - on the negativity, hatred, chaos - that you're missing the signs of life God is placing in front of you?

Even something as simple as the Easter egg reminds us of what's possible. Fragile. Ordinary. Yet within it lies the potential for life—if it breaks open. Easter challenges us to do the same: to break free from what confines us—fear, pride, addiction, doubts—and let God bring new life out of our brokenness.

Transformation isn't easy. It takes faith. Surrender. But Easter shows us that God's power brings life out of death, light out of darkness, and hope out of despair. The Resurrection isn't just something to believe—it's something to live.

Think of the disciples after the Resurrection. They were afraid, uncertain, hiding behind locked doors. But Jesus met them there. He didn't scold them for doubting—He gave them peace. He gave them the Holy Spirit and sent them out with this mission: "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." That same Spirit is alive in us today. Right now. Sending us out to roll away the stones of division, injustice, and hopelessness.

Easter isn't just a day. It's not just a season or a hashtag to trend for a week. Easter is a lifestyle. Easter is the story that gives meaning to every moment of our lives. Every time we choose love over hate, forgiveness over revenge, hope over despair, we're living the Resurrection. we're making real in the world around us.

So here is the question: where is God calling you to leave the tomb behind? Where is He planting new life in your story? Where is He inviting you to trust His promise that even in the darkest moments, the story isn't over?

So, let's rise to the challenge of being Resurrection people. Let's carry Easter's light into every shadow, every space – into our families, workplaces and communities – and yes, even into our social media feeds. Let's live that truth that because Christ is risen, we are no longer bound by fear or sin or death. So, post it, share it, live it—declare it with every word, every action, every fiber of your being: Christ is risen!

Because He lives, we live. His victory is ours. His light is our guide. His love is our mission. Alleluia!
