PARISH REGISTRATION & SACRAMENTS

ACTIVE PARISHONER

- Weekly attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.
- Volunteer on regular basis (**Time**)

- Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (Treasure)

PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for **at least six months** prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility. **To register, please email Kyle Hall at kyle.hall@charlestondiocese.org**, or you can also <u>register online</u> – scan the QR code below by opening your camera app.



Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre- registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

PRAYER

FROM THE DESK OF OUR PASTORAL ADMINISTRATOR

What does it mean that God is Trinity – Father (the Lover), Son (the Beloved), and Holy Spirit (the Love itself)? Three persons, one God? A fountain of Love. The Holy trinity is a mystery enough to make your brain do gymnastics. But here is the thing: the Trinity isn't just a theological riddle to crack. This mystery meets us right where we are—on the chaos of a Monday morning commute, the noise of a family dinner table, and yes, even in those moments scrolling through your group chats.

The Trinity calls us to wonder, awe, and a deeper connection with God's presence. "Let all mortal flesh keep silence," whispers the ancient liturgy of St. James. In an age of instant Google answers, that's pretty radical advice. British biologist Colin Tudge nails it: "All humanity, including scientists, have to learn to live with mystery; and with mystery should come humility." This wisdom reminds us that the mystery of God is not meant to frustrate us, but to invite us into something greater. And really, couldn't we all use a bit more humility these days? Amen to that.

So, how do we approach a reality as vast and awe-inspiring as the Trinity? Maybe it starts with admitting we don't have all the answers. And maybe that's the point. The Trinity isn't just a doctrine. This mystery reveals who God is. It shows us that God is both beyond comprehension and deeply involved in our lives. Yes, even the awkward conversations with your teenager. This isn't a distant, detached God we're talking about, but a Creator who loves us, sustains us, and redeems us.

The Trinity invites us to see God not as a ruler to fear, but as the source of infinite love—a love so powerful it holds everything together. What if God's power isn't about control but about a selfless, boundless love that brings life and unity? Understanding God as Trinity changes everything. It changes how we see Him—and how we see ourselves.

If we think of God only as a strict authority figure, we might feel like He's far away, someone to appease, not approach. But the Trinity paints a different picture: at His core, God is Love. Through Jesus, we see that this love isn't just something God does—it's who He is. As St. John puts it, "Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love" (1 Jn 4:8). No love? No God. Without love, our faith loses its meaning. God's love transforms us, shaping how we treat others and how we see the world.

And here's where it gets personal. The Trinity isn't just about God—it's about us, too. Relationships can be messy. Sometimes we lose ourselves in others; other times, we build walls. But the Trinity shows us a better way: perfect relationship.

The Father, Son, and Spirit are distinct yet united in a flow of self-giving love. No control. No loneliness. Just harmony and joy. It's a reminder that we're wired for connection, created to love freely, generously, and sacrificially. That ache for deep relationships? It's God's fingerprint on us.

We were created in God's image, designed to reflect His love and unity. So, how are we living this out in our communities and families? How are we allowing God's love to shape the way we connect with others?

Let's be real: the mystery of the Trinity doesn't fit neatly into analogies or explanations. When it comes to God, we often use apophatic language – acknowledging what we cannot fully describe. And that's okay. It's not a problem we're supposed to solve but a truth to experience.

When we reflect on the Trinity, we're invited to go deeper. So, the next time someone asks you about it, don't just recite doctrine. Tell them it's the key to why you were created, how to love without losing yourself, and where to find the courage to live a life that truly matters.

Because at the end of the day, the Trinity isn't about having all the answers—it's about living the questions with faith, hope, and a love that transforms everything.

After all, who said the deepest truths had to fit on a bumper sticker? They're written on our hearts and beyond.

Our Impact So Far - MICAH Loan Program

Since The MICAH Program began in 2020, we have helped 22 individuals avoid predatory lenders by providing fair, affordable loans. Instead of facing interest rates as high as 300%—common among some fringe financial institutions—our Neighbors received loans at just 4.3% interest from Self-Help Credit Union.

In total, Self-Help Credit Union issued \$27,000 in loans with our backing. More importantly, we've helped our Neighbors avoid paying more than \$59,000 in excessive interest charges. That's not just financial relief—it's empowerment, stability, and a fresh start.

Thank you to our volunteers, mentors, donors, and supporters for making this possible. Together, we are changing lives and building a more just financial future.

Prison Ministry Update
