# PARISH REGISTRATION & SACRAMENTS

## ACTIVE PARISHONER

- Weekly attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.
- Volunteer on regular basis (**Time**)

- Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (**Treasure**)

## PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for **at least six months** prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility. **To register, please email Kyle Hall at [kyle.hall@charlestdiocese.org](mailto:kyle.hall@charlestdiocese.org)**, or you can also **register online** - scan the QR code below by opening your camera app.



### Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre- registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

### First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

### Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

### Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

### Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

# PRAYER

## FROM THE DESK OF OUR PASTORAL ADMINISTRATOR

Imagine, my friends, that Jesus is standing before you. His steady gaze pierces through every wall you've built, yet it radiates compassion. His eyes see everything—your fears, doubts, failures—laid bare before Him. Then He asks, “Who do you say that I am?”

This is not a question to dismiss or sideline. It cuts to the very core of who you are. It demands more than words; it calls for a response—a response lived out in how you love, relate, serve, and believe.

So, who is Jesus to you, right now, in this moment? Is He a distant figure, someone you've heard about in church but never truly known? Is He the one you run to only in moments of desperation, when life feels unbearable and every other option has failed?

Or is He alive, real, and personal? Is He present in the raw, unpolished depths of your everyday life—in the arguments with your spouse, the loneliness scrolling through social media, or the anxiety that grips you in the dead of night? If Jesus truly walks beside you in your struggles, what would change in your life right now?

The Gospel doesn't sugarcoat who Jesus is. He isn't a convenient Savior for emergencies or a comforting idea to admire from a distance. He is the risen Lord, the Son of God, who came to rescue, redeem, and transform you—yes, you. In a world weighed down by chaos, division, wars, and pain, His question becomes even more urgent. When injustice screams louder than hope, and brokenness feels like a constant companion, how will you respond?

Peter once faced this same question and answered boldly, “You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.” His proclamation wasn't born of perfect understanding but of raw faith—a leap into the unknown. Peter, impulsive and flawed, spoke a truth that changed everything. Jesus met that faith with an incredible promise: “Upon this rock, I will build my Church.” The “rock” wasn't Peter's perfection; it was his unfiltered faith. If God could build His Church on the faith of someone as imperfect as Peter, imagine what He can do with your faith, no matter how fragile.

Do you trust Him enough to let Him use your brokenness? The key to the Kingdom is simple: to see Jesus as “the Christ, the Son of the living God.” He Himself said, “God is not the God of the dead, but of the living” (Lk 20:38). Jesus is alive. Yet many would rather keep Him dead—controllable, predictable, even marketable. But He is not dead. He is alive and present everywhere: in the eyes of the stranger, the sinner, the outsider, the immigrant. This truth isn't meant to exclude or control—it's meant to open, to invite.

Faith isn't easy. It's bold, messy, and transformative. It pushes us beyond our comfort zones, challenging us to forgive the unforgivable, love the unlovable, and discover hope in the shadows. The resurrected, living Jesus tears down every boundary we create.

So, what walls in your heart need to fall today? What needs to change in your family, your community, your life?

Look at Peter again. He swore he would never deny Jesus, yet crumbled under fear and shame. Or Paul, once a persecutor of Christians, who became one of the Church's greatest leaders. These stories remind us: God doesn't call the perfect. He redeems the broken and uses them for His glory.

What's holding you back? Do you feel too flawed, too far gone? Do you think your mistakes are beyond God's grace?

Here's the truth: It's not about what you've done—it's about what Jesus can do. His grace meets you exactly where you are. It transforms your present, no matter how messy, and secures your future in Him.

In a culture obsessed with perfection and Instagram-worthy lives, this message hits differently. You are more than your failures. You are more than your shortcomings. Jesus' sacrifice on the cross declares that loud and clear. His resurrection isn't just a historical event—it's the foundation of hope. The victory over sin and death.

So, how do you define your relationship with Him? The Gospel is alive because Jesus is alive. And if He is alive in you, then no failure, no doubt, no fear can stop what He can do through you.

Your answer to Jesus' question doesn't just define who He is to you—it defines who you are. Will you stay on the sidelines, or will you let His truth transform your life today? Let your life be your answer. Start now.

## Visiting Priest: Fr. Eric Cadin with FOCUS

The weekend of July 5-6, 2025, **Father Eric Cadin will be visiting our parish on behalf of Fellowship of Catholic University Students (FOCUS)**. Fr. Eric is the Vocations Director for the Archdiocese of Boston where he works to create a culture of vocations with parish youth groups, high schools, colleges, and young professionals. Fr. Eric grew up in Saint Francis Xavier Parish in South Weymouth where he attended the parochial school. He went on to the Roxbury Latin School and then Harvard College. He was ordained in 2012. FOCUS is a national organization serving college students at more than 255 campus/locations including nine international locations, 29 parish venues and nine digital expansion campuses. More than 1048 FOCUS missionaries invite college students into a relationship with Christ and His Church, while equipping them for a lifetime of Catholic evangelization. Fr. ## The MICAH Program Ministry – Bridge to Wheels

In Fall 2023, the MICAH Program partnered with **Miracle Hill Ministries** in Greenville, SC, to launch the **Bridge to Wheels (BTWs)** program – an initiative that helps individuals in Miracle Hill's **Transitional Housing Program** obtain reliable transportation through low-interest car loans. To qualify, participants must:

- Be continuously employed for at least **3 months**
- Hold a valid **South Carolina driver's license**
- Provide a **20% down payment** on the vehicle

All vehicles are purchased from Miracle Hill Automotive, and loans are capped at \$5,000.

Since its launch, 15 Neighbors have received loans through BTWs. Without this support, many would have resorted to "Buy Here/Pay Here" car lots, where interest rates can exceed 44% and vehicles are often unreliable. Instead, BTWs participants receive fair financing – averaging just 4.3% interest – and save significantly. To date, the program has saved participants more than \$38,000 in interest, nearly equal to the total value of the vehicles purchased. Reliable transportation leads to steady employment – and ultimately, to stable housing.

We are always seeking volunteers to support this life-changing ministry – whether through mentorship, transportation support, or financial coaching.
