PARISH REGISTRATION & SACRAMENTS

ACTIVE PARISHONER

- Weekly attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.
- Volunteer on regular basis (**Time**)

- Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (Treasure)

PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for **at least six months** prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility. **To register, please email Kyle Hall at kyle.hall@charlestondiocese.org**, or you can also <u>register online</u> – scan the QR code below by opening your camera app.



Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre- registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

PRAYER

FROM THE DESK OF OUR PASTORAL ADMINISTRATOR

My dear friends, have you ever paused to marvel at the profound mystery we celebrate every Sunday? It's not just a tradition or routine—it's an encounter with Jesus' eternal promise: "Behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." These words are more than comfort; they are a bold declaration of His constant, real presence—most tangibly experienced in the Eucharist.

In the Eucharist, we don't just remember Christ; we meet Him. Right here, right now, He fulfills His promise. But this sacred sacrament is more than something we passively receive—it's the source of transformation. When we welcome Jesus through the Eucharist, we are immersed in His radical love, a love that unites us with Him and with one another. Together, we become His Body, His hands and feet in the world, tasked with sharing His light, hope, and love. How is Christ calling you to be His hands and feet in the world this week?

Think of the Last Supper. It wasn't just a meal—it was self-giving love in action. Jesus humbled Himself, washed His disciples' feet, and said, "Do as I have done for you." This is Eucharistic love: a love that serves, sacrifices, and gives completely. Every time we approach the Altar, we are invited to live this love—to be transformed into Christ's presence for the world. As St. Augustine said, "We become what we receive."

When we care for the sick, feed the hungry, comfort the lonely, or stand with the marginalized, we aren't just performing acts of kindness—we are living as Christ's Body. The Eucharist sends us forth, reminding us that we never walk this mission alone. Christ meets us in our struggles, doubts, and hopes, healing our wounds and transforming them into love.

As Pope Francis reminded us: the Eucharist heals rejection with belonging, fear with hope, and loneliness with love. When we receive Jesus, He sees our beauty and worth, calling us to see others the same way. He asks us to let our lives be taken, blessed, broken, and shared for the world.

So, what does this mean for us today? It means the Eucharist is not just a ritual—it's a calling. When we say "Amen," we declare: "Yes, Lord. Take me. Transform me. Use me for Your mission."

This week, let us make a concrete commitment to live out the Eucharist in our daily lives. Here is a challenge: identify one specific act of love and service that you can do for someone in need. Maybe it's visiting a lonely neighbor, preparing a meal for someone struggling, volunteering your time to serve the poor, or simply offering a kind word to someone who needs encouragement. Whatever it is, do it intentionally, as a reflection of the love you have received in the Eucharist. Let your actions proclaim the good news of Christ's presence in the world.

This is who we are. This is what we are made for. This is why we celebrate. Let's approach the altar with hearts wide open, ready to be renewed, ready to be sent forth as living reflections of Christ's infinite love. Amen, amen.

Our Impact So Far - MICAH Loan Program

Since The MICAH Program began in 2020, we have helped 22 individuals avoid predatory lenders by providing fair, affordable loans. Instead of facing interest rates as high as 300%—common among some fringe financial institutions—our Neighbors received loans at just 4.3% interest from Self-Help Credit Union.

In total, Self-Help Credit Union issued \$27,000 in loans with our backing. More importantly, we've helped our Neighbors avoid paying more than \$59,000 in excessive interest charges. That's not just financial relief—it's empowerment, stability, and a fresh start.

Thank you to our volunteers, mentors, donors, and supporters for making this possible. Together, we are changing lives and building a more just financial future.
