PARISH REGISTRATION & SACRAMENTS

ACTIVE PARISHONER

- Volunteer on regular basis (**Time**)

- Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (Treasure)

PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for **at least six months** prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility. **To register**, **please email Kyle Hall at kyle.hall@charlestondiocese.org**, or you can also <u>register online</u> – scan the QR code below by opening your camera app.



Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre- registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

PRAYER

FROM THE DESK OF OUR PASTORAL ADMINISTRATOR

My friends, imagine hearing these words: "Your name is written in heaven." Let that sink in. What would it mean to you? Would it change the way you live today?

Without the confidence that we are known and chosen by God, life can feel like a heavy burden. Every day becomes a race to prove ourselves. In a world obsessed with self-promotion and comparison, we're tempted to build our identity on achievements, approval, and recognition. But that pursuit is exhausting. It's a zero-sum game where we're all striving for dignity and importance, often at the expense of others.

Yet, God offers us a different way. Instead of scarcity, He gives abundance. Instead of competition, He offers mutual flourishing. Spiritual gifts, unlike material ones, multiply as we share them. They grow in us and in those around us.

To know your name is written in heaven is to live with a deeper purpose. It's not about chasing temporary goals, applause, or validation. It's about eternal joy. A joy rooted in being fully known, deeply seen, and unconditionally loved by God. Think about Isaiah 49:16: "See, I have engraved you on the palms of my hands." Pause for a moment. Imagine that. Your name, written by God Himself. What does that say about His love for you?

This truth calls us to ask the big questions: What truly gives my life meaning? What legacy will I leave behind? These questions lead us to the heart of what it means to be God's beloved. It's not about striving for perfection or success. It's about anchoring our identity in God's unchanging love and His promise to redeem us and the world.

When we embrace this assurance, we can live differently. We can choose faith over fear. Purpose over approval. Healing over division. Yes, the world encourages comparison and relentless striving. But God doesn't measure us by résumés or follower counts. What matters to Him is faithfulness.

Having your name written in heaven isn't just personal—it's communal. It's a call to reflect Christ in how we live. To choose unity over division. Forgiveness over resentment. Connection over isolation. It's a call to love boldly, forgive freely, and serve selflessly—even when it's inconvenient or hard.

Jesus reminds us in Luke 10:3: "I am sending you out like lambs among wolves." Following Him isn't always easy. It requires humility, vulnerability, and trust that He will guide us. The world may not always welcome us, but we are never alone. Jesus walks with us, equips us, and strengthens us.

The joy of knowing your name is written in heaven isn't based on achievements. It's found in being unconditionally loved by God and being part of His greater plan. Yes, the mission is overwhelming at times. Our world is broken. The needs around us are great. But Jesus doesn't ask us to fix everything. He asks us to take one step at a time.

So let me ask you: What's one small way you can reflect His love this week? Maybe it's offering a kind word to someone who feels invisible. Maybe it's serving someone in need. Whatever it is, do it with the confidence that God is with you every step of the way.

One day, imagine standing before God. He looks at you with love and says, "Well done, good and faithful servant." Imagine the joy of knowing your name is written in heaven—not because of what you achieved, but because of who you are to Him: His beloved child.

That is the joy we live for. So this week, live in that joy. Share that love. And trust that the One who has written your name in heaven is walking with you, always.

Safety Committee Update

Dear St. Anthony's Church Family,

I hope this message finds you well. It has come to our attention that individuals have recently been approaching members of our congregation in the church parking lot to ask for money. While we are called as Christians to show compassion to those in need, we must also be mindful of the safety and well-being of all who attend our services and events.

Out of an abundance of caution, we kindly ask that you refrain from giving money or personal items to individuals soliciting in the parking lot. Though some may have genuine needs, others may not, and unfortunately, such situations can attract unsafe or disruptive behavior, putting members, especially families, seniors, and children, at risk.

Our primary concerns include:

- Personal safety during these encounters, especially in isolated areas or after dark
- Increased traffic of panhandling that may lead to disturbances or confrontations
- The potential for distraction or targeting of parishioners, especially those alone

How You Can Help Safely:

If you feel moved to assist those in need, we encourage you to support our church's outreach ministries or local charitable organizations that are equipped to provide food, shelter, and long-term support in a secure and accountable manner. If you witness any concerning behavior in the parking lot or on church grounds, please do not approach the individuals directly. Instead, notify a staff member, an usher, or staff members immediately. Let us continue to be a church that serves with compassion while

exercising discernment and care for one another.

Thank you for your cooperation, understanding, and ongoing support in keeping our church a safe and welcoming place for all.
