

PARISH REGISTRATION & SACRAMENTS

ACTIVE PARISHONER

- Weekly attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.
- Volunteer on regular basis (**Time**)
- Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (Talent)
- Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (Treasure)

PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony must be registered members for at least six months prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility. To register, please email Kyle Hall at kyle.hall@charlestondiocese.org, or you can also register online - scan the QR code below by opening your camera app.



Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre-registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

PRAYER

FROM THE DESK OF OUR PASTORAL ADMINISTRATOR

Have you ever felt stuck—like you're caught in the quicksand of life's routines, wondering if there's something more? What's driving your choices, shaping who you are, and fueling your purpose? Is it the pull of social media, ambition, algorithms, daily habits – or perhaps a deeper call stirring somewhere within you?

These days, one of the biggest risks we face is living on autopilot—going through the motions, numbed by distractions, and consumed by fleeting trends. When we lose sight of what truly matters, our dreams fade, our ideals weaken, and life begins to drain its meaning. So, how do we break free from this dormant state? How do we wake up and ask ourselves: **What anchors my heart? What's guiding my life?**

What you believe—whether grounded in faith, values, or your personal worldview—shapes everything: how you see the world, how you connect with others, and how you face challenges. In the Gospel of Luke 12, Jesus calls us to "stay awake," urging us to resist the temptation of sleepwalking through life. Faith, He teaches, isn't something passive. It's active, liberating, and alive. It's found in the tiny, everyday choices we make: choosing kindness over indifference, hope over despair, gratitude over discontent, and charity over gossip. As James reminds us, "Faith without works is dead" (2:26).

But let's be honest – sometimes even faith can fall into routine—reduced to tradition, hollow habits, or just another checkbox on a Sunday to-do list. This kind of passive faith is fragile. It crumbles under pressure and is easily replaced by whatever feels more convenient or appealing. We can even treat faith like a product, "shopping" for a church or spiritual experience that feels good, rather than embracing the deeper, harder work of commitment, community, and transformation.

True faith, though? It asks more of us. It compels us to wrestle with doubts, confront uncertainties, and make choices that truly changes us. Faith doesn't erase life's chaos—it equips us to navigate it with courage and grace. Philosopher Paul Tillich described faith as our "ultimate concern"—the thing we hold closest to our hearts. Whether we realize it or not, we all put our faith in something: success, relationships, ambition, or God. Whatever we trust most shapes everything about us.

Here is the thing: Faith isn't about having all the answers. It's about trust. It's the willingness to step forward into the unknown, like Abraham, who obeyed God without knowing where it would lead—even to the point of being willing to sacrifice his only son, the son of God's promise. The letter to the Hebrews explains it best: "Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen" (11:1). This is the kind of bold and enduring faith that shaped the lives of our spiritual ancestors and continues to call us forward today: "For we walk by faith and not by sight" (2 Cor 5:7).

And Søren Kierkegaard once said it, "Life must be lived forward, but it can only be understood backward." How true that is. How often do we look back and realize how God has been guiding us all along? For Christians, faith is ultimately rooted in Jesus Christ. He reveals God's love and invites us into a relationship of trust and surrender. Through prayer, Scripture, and the work of the Holy Spirit, faith deepens. It transforms belief into action, reshapes our priorities, and leads us to "seek first the kingdom of God and His justice," trusting that everything else will fall into place (Mt 6:33).

Faith isn't something we own or check off a list. it's a relationship. It's not something we simply *have*—it's something we *live*. It's God's gift through the Spirit, pulling us toward trust, growth, and transformation. Faith doesn't remove life's storms, but it offers us a steady hand to hold and a guiding light through the darkest nights.

So, where is your faith leading you? Faith isn't about perfection—it's about direction. Let it pull you toward purpose, trust, change, and a deeper relationship with our loving Father in Jesus through the Holy Spirit.

"Lord, I believe; help my unbelief." Amen.
