PARISH REGISTRATION & SACRAMENTS

ACTIVE PARISHONER

- Weekly attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.
- Volunteer on regular basis (**Time**)

- Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (**Treasure**)

PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for **at least six months** prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility. **To register, please email Kyle Hall at kyle.hall@charlestandioocese.org**, or you can also **register online** - scan the QR code below by opening your camera app.



Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre- registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

The Treasure Hidden in the Cross: What's Holding You Back?

In a world bursting with achievements, endless entertainment, and instant gratification, why do so many of us still feel an ache deep within? An emptiness that no success, possession, or relationship seems to fill? It's like trying to patch a black hole with glitter – shiny, but ultimate futile.

That ache? It points to something far deeper: a soul-deep joy that only Christ can offer. But what is this joy? Is it just a fleeting emotion or a promise reserved for the distant future of heaven? Not quite. The joy Jesus gives is neither momentary nor tied to how we feel. It's steady. Eternal. Life-transforming. This joy is born out of knowing Him – walking with Him and embracing Him as both Savior and Friend. But this joy comes with a cost.

Dietrich Bonhoeffer once said, "When Christ calls a man, he bids him come and die." At first, this might sound unsettling, even extreme. But Bonhoeffer wasn't talking about physical death. He meant surrendering our self-centered desires, ambitions, and illusions of control. Why? So that we can fully embrace Christ's life and mission.

Here is the thing: we live in a world that worships convenience and comfort. Fast food. Same-day shipping. Drive-thru everything—even faith. "Drive-thru Christianity" offers quick, feel-good messages that leave our comfort intact. But Jesus? He never sugarcoated the cost of following Him. He said, **"If anyone wants to come after me, let him deny himself, take up his cross daily, and follow me."** This wasn't poetic language. It was a radical call to reorder every aspect of our lives—our relationships, dreams, possessions, and even our identity—around Him.

In Luke's Gospel, Jesus uses startling words: "If anyone comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters—yes, even their own life—such a person cannot be my disciple." Of course, this isn't call to hostility but rather **a demand for radical prioritization – a love for Him so deep that no other relationship comes close.** Similarly, in Matthew, He declares, "Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me." His message is clear: Jesus must come first—above everything and everyone.

This call was as shocking in Jesus' time as it is today. For His first disciples, following Him meant leaving behind everything—jobs, security, family ties, and social standing—for a life centered on the cross.

So why would anyone choose such a path? Because those who truly follow Jesus find in Him something worth losing everything for. **The cross is more than a symbol of sacrifice; it is the doorway to life.** Jesus' ultimate sacrifice opened the way to joy, salvation, and eternity. And the crosses we carry today compel us to wrestle with life's deepest questions: What am I living for? What truly matters in the end?

Fear, attachment to comfort, and the illusion of control often hold us back. But following Jesus isn't about focusing on what you lose—it's about realizing what you gain. It's a trade: the temporary for the eternal, the shallow for the profound, the fleeting for the everlasting. Bonhoeffer called this "costly grace." It demands everything, but it gives infinitely more. It's the treasure hidden in a field, the pearl of great price. This grace doesn't just change your life—it reshapes it for eternity.

The psalmist prayed, "Teach us to number our days, that we may gain a heart of wisdom." Life is short. Don't waste it chasing what won't last. The crosses we bear for Christ are like chisels in His hands, shaping us into the disciples we were created to be. Every burden, every surrender, every step of obedience carves away the rough edges of our lives, revealing the masterpiece God intended all along.

So, **what's holding you back from fully following Jesus?** He isn't asking for part of your heart—He's asking for all of it.

The joy Jesus offers isn't just a distant promise of heaven; it's a deep, abiding peace that anchors you in life's storms. It's the quiet assurance that you are fully known and fully loved. It's the freedom of living for something eternal, rather than being enslaved by the temporary. This is the joy that transforms, sustains, and fulfills in a way nothing else can.

Every day, the choice is yours. **Will you surrender your plans, your comfort, your fears—and say yes to Him?** Say yes to Jesus today. Say yes to the soul-deep joy that comes from truly following Him.
