PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for **at least six months** prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility. **To register, please email Kyle Hall at kyle.hall@charlestondiocese.org**, or you can also <u>register online</u> – scan the QR code below by opening your camera app.



Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre- registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

Breaking the Walls of Indifference: Seeing Lazarus at Our Gate

Have you ever passed by someone in need and felt a twinge of quilt, wondering if you should have stopped to help? Most of us have. This Sunday's Gospel, Lk 16:19-31, brings us face to face with one of the most dangerous and sneaky sins: indifference. It challenges us to examine how we respond—or fail to respond—to the needs around us and the connections we often ignore .

The parable introduces two figures: a rich man and a poor beggar named Lazarus. The rich man lives in luxury, feasting daily, while Lazarus—whose name aptly means "God helps," -sits at the gate. His frail body, covered in sores, is exposed to the cold as he longs for scraps from the rich man's table. Their story highlights not just the stark contrast in their lives but also the total absence of connection between them. The rich man isn't outwardly cruel; he's indifferent. This apathy creates an invisible wall, separating him from Lazarus and his suffering. It's a sobering reminder that our greatest failures often lie not in what we do, but in what we fail to do. Ouch. A hard truth to face, isn't it?

Lazarus represents the faces we often overlook: the homeless, the lonely, the marginalized-those who feel invisible. The parable reveals that the deepest poverty isn't material but relational; the anguish of being unseen, unheard, and forgotten. In our hyperconnected world, isn't it ironic how many feel disconnected and invisible? The Gospel compels us to open our eyes-not just to physical needs but to the deeper hunger for kindness, love, and recognition. When was the last time you truly saw someone in need, not as a problem to avoid but as a person to love? Go ahead think about it, I'll wait.

Complacency is like wearing blinders—it lets us stroll through life without noticing the suffering right in front of us. And isn't this exactly where we are as a society? Walls of apathy are everywhere, built higher by polarization, cancel culture, and the ease of publicly shaming someone from behind the screen. Quick judgments and harsh words are the new normal. By dismissing others, we become like the rich man, indifferent to the Lazaruses at our gates. When we stop seeing our neighbors as fellow humans and start viewing them as enemies—or, worse, as invisible – are we not replicating the rich man's sin on a larger scale?

But here's the twist of the parable: after death, the roles reverse: Lazarus is comforted, and the rich man becomes the beggar. Even in torment, the rich man clings to his blindness, seeing Lazarus not as an equal - just as a servant for his needs, not a person to love. When he asks Abraham to send Lazarus to warn his brothers to repent, Abraham's response is clear: "They have Moses and the prophets; let them listen to them." Translation? You already know what to do. Love our neighbor. Care for the poor. Show compassion. No miracle or heavenly sign will change a heart that refuses to open.

Lazarus stands as a living reminder of God's call to compassion. How we treat the marginalized shapes our own path to salvation. Jesus makes this clear in Matthew 25:45: "Whatever you neglected to do for the least of these, you neglected to do for me." So, who are the "Lazarus figures" in your life? Is it the struggling single parent? The immigrant family next door? The friend who doesn't have the courage to ask for help? They are real people. Jesus calls us to see them, care for them, and act.

Mother Teresa captured this truth so simply. When asked why she served the poor, she would point to her hand, wiggling one finger at a time as she recited Jesus' words: "You did it to me." For her, every act of kindness—no matter how small—was a way of loving Christ. She encouraged others to "find their own Calcutta," even if it's just down the street. God is present in the needs around us. So, what's stopping us from wiggling our fingers and getting to work?

This week, pause and ask yourself: Who is sitting at my gate? It's so easy to slip into a comfortable bubble and let life become all about "me, myself, and I." But as the rich man learned too late, ignoring others creates a gap - not just between us and them, but between us and God. Imagine a world where no one feels invisible, where every Lazarus is met with compassion, where walls of apathy are replaced with bridges of connection, and where love is the universal language. Sounds like the Kingdom of God, doesn't it?

So, who might be silently waiting for you to notice them? Whether through a kind word, a helping hand, or a listening ear, we can close the gap of indifference and foster a culture of encounter and compassion, By embracing our shared humanity, we grow closer to God's glory. Let's not wait until it's too late. Because in serving others, we find God. Let's tear down the walls of indifference and build the Kingdom of God-one small act of love at a time.
