## PARISH REGISTRATION & SACRAMENTS

#### **ACTIVE PARISHONER**

- Weekly attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.
- Volunteer on regular basis (**Time**)
- Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**)
- Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (Treasure)

#### PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for **at least six months** prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility. **To register, please email Kyle Hall at kyle.hall@charlestondiocese.org**, or you can also <u>register online</u> – scan the QR code below by opening your camera app.



#### **Infant Baptism Class for Parents**

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre- registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

#### **First Holy Communion**

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

#### Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

#### Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

#### Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

## **PRAYER**

#### FROM THE DESK OF OUR PASTORAL ADMINISTRATOR

#### The Glorious Paradox: Embracing the Cross as the Ultimate Sign of Love, Redemption, and Life

This Sunday, as we celebrate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, we are invited to confront a profound mystery: How could a symbol of humiliation and death—the cross—become the ultimate declaration of life, love, and victory? It defies human logic yet resonates deeply with heart of our faith: a God who turns suffering into redemption, shame into glory, and death into eternal life. What does this transformation reveal about the God we worship and the life we are called to lead?

In the first century, the cross was a symbol of humiliation and torture, stripping its victims of dignity. To Jesus' contemporaries, honoring such a symbol would have been unthinkable—offensive even. Yet, as Christians, we exalt the cross. Why? Because it proclaims a truth that transforms everything: **love has the final word.** 

In the Franciscan tradition, theologians like Duns Scotus remind us that the cross was not a 'plan B'—a desperate response to human sin. Instead, it was always part of God's eternal design to dwell with us in love. Even the very first letter of the Torah, 'Bet,' speaks of God's desire to build His dwelling, His kingdom, among us. The cross, then, is not a mere transaction to pay for sin but a revelation of God's boundless, self-giving love. On the cross, this love is poured out in a way that calls us back into relationship with God. True love doesn't send an invoice; it extends an open invitation.

The exaltation of the Holy Cross is not just a commemoration—it is an invitation to see ourselves and our lives through the lens of God's transforming love. Have you ever felt unworthy, broken, or burdened by wounds no one else can see? The cross reminds us that no pain is too deep, no heart too broken, for God's love to heal and transform. It calls us to bring our brokenness to God, trusting that He can make all things new.

The story of the cross is not an isolated event in Salvation history. It echoes the account of Moses lifting the bronze serpent in the wilderness (Num 21), a foreshadowing of Christ's own sacrifice. Just as the serpent brought healing to the Israelites, rebellious and grumbling against God, so too Jesus, lifted upon the cross, brings salvation to all of humanity. But this salvation is not abstract or distant—it is deeply personal and transformative, reaching into the depths of our brokenness. The cross becomes the bridge drawing us into God's embrace.

On the cross, Jesus didn't just see humanity's pain—He entered it. He felt the sting of rejection, the weight of shame, and the agony of separation. And through it all, His love never wavered. In John 3:16, we hear the familiar words: "God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son." Unlike the gods in the Roman world, often perceived as distant or indifferent, the God revealed in Jesus is revolutionary—loving even broken, rebellious humanity. This love is glorified on the cross, not through power or dominance but through self-giving.

St. Paul, writing to the Philippians, uses the Greek term **kenosis** –"**self-emptying**" – to describe that **Jesus did not cling to power or privilege but instead humbled Himself**, becoming a servant and willingly accepting death—even death on a cross. He allowed Himself to be nailed to the wood, arms outstretched in an embrace that transcends time and space. In doing so, He revealed the futility of striving for worldly power and showed us that **true strength lies in love**, **humility**, **and service**. It's like the ultimate plot twist: the meek shall inherit the earth. Who could have imagined it?

What does it mean to live this truth daily? It looks like compassion over competition. Forgiveness over resentment. Humility over pride. It means sitting with someone in their pain, even when it's uncomfortable. The cross calls us to let love—not pride or fear—guide our actions.

As Christians, we are called to embody God's compassion in the world. This means entering into the messiness of life, sharing in the pain of others, and allowing our hearts to be transformed by love. Jesus didn't shy away from the wounds of the world; He entered fully into them, becoming the wound, the tears, and the cry. And in doing so, He transformed everything, drawing all creation back to God - "Until God is all in all" (1Cor 15:28). From the arms of the cross, Christ calls us into a love that reshapes how we live, love, and serve.

This Sunday, as we lift our eyes to the cross, let us heed its radical call: to **let go of fear, pride, or resentment, and to choose love, humility, and service.** Will we allow the cross to reshape our hearts and lead you into a life of renewal, hope, and courage?


