PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for **at least six months** prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility. **To register, please email Kyle Hall at kyle.hall@charlestondiocese.org**, or you can also <u>register online</u> – scan the QR code below by opening your camera app.



Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre- registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

FROM THE DESK OF OUR PASTORAL ADMINISTRATOR

How Long, O Lord? Finding Faith, Hope, and Purpose in the Waiting

This Sunday, we are confronted with a question that echoes through the corridors of time: "How long, O Lord?" It is the anguished cry of Habakkuk, wrestling with God amidst turmoil. It is the lament of the psalmist: "How long, O Lord? Will you forget me forever?" (13:1). It is the plea of the martyrs in Revelation: "How long before you will judge and avenge our blood?" (6:10). Though separated by centuries, these voices converge in a **shared longing - for justice**, **for redemption**, **for God to intervene**. Today, their cries resonate in the hearts of those who long for healing, reconciliation, and restoration.

"How long?" This cry rises from those crushed under the weight of fractured political and social systems—victims of injustice and witnesses of violence. It's the cry of divided communities torn apart by hatred and extremism. It's the cry of the grieving mother mourning her child lost to senseless violence. It's the silent plea of those drowning in the toxic noise of social media, the pain of personal struggles, and the ache of waiting. It is our cry too, whispered in moments of loss, confusion, and despair: "How long, O Lord?"

But here's the hope: Scripture does not turn away from this tension. It meets us in the very heart of it. The Bible doesn't sugarcoat our pain or dismiss our doubts, fears, and frustrations. Instead, it shows us that faith and lament can coexist. Habakkuk's cried, "Why do you let me see ruin; why must I look at misery? Destruction, social unrest, and violence are before me; there is strife, and clamorous discord" (1:3). Sound familiar? His lament mirrors today's headlines. And yet, Scripture reveals a profound truth: faith is not the absence of doubt but the persistence of trust.

Faith lives in the tension between the cry and the answer, between the pain of waiting and the promise of God's faithfulness. It is the vulnerable prayer of the apostles: "Lord, increase our faith" (Lk 17:5). Faith does not demand instant resolution; it clings to the conviction that God's promises will come to pass.

This faith-filled hope is not passive. It is active, resilient, and rooted in God's unchanging character. Habakkuk reminds us, "The vision still has its time, presses on to fulfillment, and will not disappoint; if it delays, wait for it, it will surely come, it will not be late" (2:3). God's clock is not broken, even if it doesn't sync with ours. Waiting on Him is not resignation—it is a call to live with courage, compassion, and hope, resisting the pull of despair.

Even when our faith feels as tiny as a mustard seed (or, on some days, more like a mustard crumb), Jesus assures us that it is enough. "If you have faith the size of a mustard seed," He says, "you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you" (Lk 17:6). This powerful image speaks to the deep-rooted systems of injustice and violence in our world. **Faith, no matter how fragile,** carries the potential for transformation—not because of its size, but because of the One in whom we place it.

In this season of uncertainty, let's hold onto God's vision for justice and redemption, even when it feels like it's stuck in traffic. And we are called to act—planting seeds of kindness, seeking unity amid division, and embodying God's peace and healing in a hurting world. **Faith doesn't retreat**; it calls us to live as witnesses of God's promises with courage, hope, and love.

And as we wait, let's not forget this: **We are not alone.** The One who carried the cross before us walks with us still. He is our strength in the struggle, our peace in the chaos, our hope in the waiting. So, I ask you today: How will you live by faith in the tension of "How long?" How will you trust in the promise, even when it feels delayed?

My dear St. Anthony family, let us anchor our hearts in His unshakable promises, for they will not fail. **Hold on, keep the faith, and know this: His vision will come to pass, and His love will sustain us.** So, let's live in hope, act in love, and trust in His timing. **Hallelujah!**
