

# PARISH REGISTRATION & SACRAMENTS

### **ACTIVE PARISHONER**

- Weekly attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.
- Volunteer on regular basis (**Time**)
- Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (Talent)
- Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (Treasure)

### PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for **at least six months** prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility. **To register, please email Kyle Hall at kyle.hall@charlestondiocese.org**, or you can also <u>register online</u> – scan the QR code below by opening your camera app.



#### **Infant Baptism Class for Parents**

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre- registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

### **First Holy Communion**

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

### Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

#### Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

### Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

### Beyond the Noise: Gratitude and Radical Inclusion

In a world where social media debates escalate into battlegrounds and headlines fuel division, it's easy to feel like we're losing touch with our shared humanity. How do we rise above the noise? **How can we embody something deeper—gratitude and radical inclusion—** in a culture that often thrives on separation and hostility?

This Sunday's Gospel offers us a profound lens: **the story of the ten lepers (Lk 17:11-19)**. Outcast from society, they encounter Jesus and experience healing. Yet only one—a Samaritan, the outsider—returns to give thanks. His gratitude wasn't just a polite gesture; it transformed him. In that moment, he received not only physical healing but also the fullness of Christ's love and salvation. Gratitude, then, is more than a simple response—it becomes a doorway to transformation. As Meister Eckhart, the great 13th-century mystic, said, **"If the only prayer you said was thank you, that would be enough."** 

St. Paul's words to the Thessalonians echo this truth: "In all circumstances, give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus." Yet let's be honest—gratitude isn't always our first instinct. How often do we pause to notice and appreciate the ways God moves in our lives? Not just in the big, obvious blessings but in the quiet, everyday moments we often overlook? Gratitude shifts our perspective, pulling us away from what divides us and pointing us toward what unites us: God's abundant grace. It reminds us that even in our brokenness, we are recipients of mercy and love. When we cultivate a grateful heart, it softens our divisions and allows us to see others not as adversaries but as fellow children of God.

But gratitude is only the beginning. Jesus's healing power points us toward something even greater: radical inclusion. **Jesus didn't limit His healing based on race, status, or belief. The Samaritan—someone society deemed unworthy—was embraced, restored, and saved.** Think about that. In today's culture, where canceling, labeling, and judging have become second nature, this message feels more urgent than ever. Who are the "lepers" in our lives? Who are the people we've avoided, excluded, or dismissed? Maybe it's someone who's hurt us. Maybe it's someone we don't understand, or even that coworker with the frustrating political opinions. That family member with the grudge? Jesus calls us to love boldly, to break down the barriers we've built, and to extend the same inclusion and mercy that He offers to us. Jesus is calling us to something greater. Radical inclusion means breaking down those walls—those walls of judgment, pride, and fear—and seeing people the way God sees them as beloved children of God, worthy of dignity, grace, and belonging.

Living with gratitude and inclusion isn't easy. **It takes humility to recognize God's blessings and courage to embrace those who challenge us.** But when we do, we reflect Christ's heart in a deeply fractured world. Gratitude moves us to action, opening our hands to serve and our hearts to love. Inclusion bridges divides, reminding us that no one is beyond the reach of God's grace.

This week, here is your challenge: let's take time to pause and recognize the ways God is at work in our lives. Let's name the blessings we've overlooked and allow gratitude to reshape our hearts. And let's take one small step toward inclusion—reach out to that person you've avoided. Listen without judgment. Offer forgiveness, even if it's hard. Because when we do, we open the door for God's grace to flow through us. And oh, church, when God's grace flows, healing happens. Amen.

### Thank You from the Prison Ministry & Kairos Program

# **NEWS FROM OUR SCHOOL**

Dear St. Anthony of Padua Community,

I am pleased to share an exciting step forward in our commitment to academic excellence for the 2025-2026 school year. Through a strategic renewal effort, we are launching a focused teacher-formation program that will deepen our faculty's expertise in differentiated instruction and assessment in reading. By securing dedicated funding from the Institute for Multi-Sensory Education (IMSE), we are establishing a cohesive pedagogical foundation that will strengthen our school culture and lift student outcomes across every tier of our Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS).

#### **Professional Development in Literacy**

IMSE's structured-literacy training, aligned with the Science of Reading, will be offered in two accredited courses tailored to each grade level:

- 1. **Impact Comprehensive Orton-Gillingham Plus (30 hrs)** An in-depth exploration of the Orton-Gillingham methodology, covering phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension.
- 2. Impact Morphology Plus (30 hrs) A focus on morphology, vocabulary, and comprehension strategies that enrich literacy instruction.

### What We Anticipate for Our School

- 1. **Enhanced Teacher Expertise** All participating teachers will become proficient in the Science of Reading and Structured Literacy approaches.
- 2. **Targeted Support for Readers** Faculty will be equipped to identify and assist students with reading difficulties, including dyslexia, using evidence-based methods.
- 3. **Data-Driven**, **Differentiated Instruction** Assessment data will guide instruction across all MTSS tiers, ensuring each learner receives the support they need.
- 4. **Multi-Sensory Learning Integration** Teachers will embed multi-sensory strategies into daily literacy lessons, fostering deeper engagement and retention.
- 5. **Access to Digital Resources** IMSE's digital tools will streamline lesson planning, progress monitoring, and individualized student support.

By investing in this comprehensive professional development, we are not only raising the bar for instructional quality but also nurturing a collaborative, growth-oriented culture that reflects our Catholic values of excellence, compassion, and service.
