

# PARISH REGISTRATION & SACRAMENTS

#### **ACTIVE PARISHONER**

- Weekly attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.
- Volunteer on regular basis (**Time**)
- Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**)
- Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (Treasure)

#### PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for **at least six months** prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility. **To register, please email Kyle Hall at kyle.hall@charlestondiocese.org**, or you can also <u>register online</u> – scan the QR code below by opening your camera app.



#### **Infant Baptism Class for Parents**

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre- registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

#### **First Holy Communion**

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

#### Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

#### Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

#### Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

#### Faith That Fights: The Widow's Cry and the Unyielding Pursuit of Justice

What does it mean to have a faith that refuses to throw in the towel, even in the face of injustice? The parable of the widow and the unjust judge invites us to wrestle with this question. It's a story that lingers in our minds, layered with meaning and designed to challenge our assumptions. At its core, the parable calls us to persistent prayer. It reminds us to trust that God hears the cries of those seeking justice. But it's also more than that—it's an urgent reminder of the unbreakable bond between faith, prayer, and the pursuit of justice. In a world that so often silences or ignores the vulnerable, the widow's unwavering voice presses us to ask: how far are we willing to go to stand with those whose pleas for justice are ignored?

To fully grasp the widow's story, we must step into her world. In biblical times, widows were the epitome of vulnerability and powerlessness. The Hebrew word for widow, *almanah*, carries the idea of being "silent" or "unable to speak," while the Greek word *chera* suggests being "forsaken" or "left empty." In ancient Hebrew culture, widows lacked protection, advocates, and often the means to survive. They were completely reliant on the mercy of others, leaving them vulnerable to exploitation. Against this backdrop, the widow's demand for justice isn't just a personal plea—it's a desperate fight for survival. Her persistence in confronting an unjust judge who neither cares for God or people, reveals incredible resilience and strength. Her cry of "Do me justice" resonates across centuries, giving voice to anyone who has ever felt marginalized, silenced, or invisible.

Her story is a mirror for our world today. From refugees fleeing violence to communities demanding equality, **countless voices remain unheard—silenced by fear, oppression, or indifference**. Her unyielding pursuit of justice reminds us of the urgent need to advocate for the voiceless. Who are the modern-day widows among us? Who is being silenced, ignored, or left behind in our societies, our communities, even our churches? For the widow, persistence wasn't just about survival, it was an act of faith. It was a prayer that refused to abandon hope in the promise of justice.

Throughout Luke's Gospel, widows are symbols of the oppressed, marginalized, the forgotten. Widows, orphans, and strangers represent the powerless and their struggles mirror the larger call to seek God's kingdom and His justice. **Jesus' ministry consistently uplifted the powerless and dismantled systems that perpetuated oppression**. In this light, the widow emerges as a symbol of faith and determination, embodying the values of God's kingdom.

This parable challenges us to examine our own faith and priorities. Is our prayer life focused solely on personal needs and desires, or does it drive us toward justice, compassion, and action on behalf of others? The widow's persistence teaches us that prayer is not about pestering God until we get what we want. Rather, it's about aligning our hearts with His will—His justice, mercy, and love. True prayer doesn't end with words. It calls us to action, to partner with God in creating a world that reflects His kingdom.

The parable also reminds us that justice and compassion must go hand in hand. Building a just community requires more than addressing the wrongs – it demands reconciliation, healing, and transformation. How desperately do we need this today? Jesus closes the parable with a haunting question: "When the Son of Man returns, will He find faith on earth?" This faith isn't just passive belief—it's an active, prayerful pursuit of justice alongside God.

In a world burdened by suffering, injustice, and silence, the widow's voice calls us to action. **Dorothy Day once said, "if we remain silent in the face of injustice, the very stones of the street will cry out."** Her words remind us that silence is never an option in the face of suffering.

This parable demands more than passive prayer. It calls us to embody God's justice. To live out God's love and justice in every choice, every act, and every moment. Faith, prayer, and justice cannot be separated—they are the lifeblood of God's kingdom. My friends, the widow's story is a radical declaration of hope, a faith that dares to believe in a world transformed by God's justice and love. Let us answer her call.

#### PRAY FOR OUR MILITARY

The men and women who serve in the armed forces do so with a sacrificial love for our country and the world. Lifting them up in prayer to our Lord must be our humble, and yet great support for them.

Lord, may your love encircle our military as they work across the world to install justice and peace for all. And be their hope through the difficulties and stress they face each day.

#### Autumn at St. Anthony of Padua Catholic School

Our students are embracing the beauty and spirit of the fall season with a variety of engaging and faith-filled learning experiences.

In **Pre-K**, students are continuing their nature studies, focusing on the life cycle of the pumpkin. Through hands-on exploration, they're discovering how God's creation changes and grows with each season.
