# PARISH REGISTRATION & SACRAMENTS

## ACTIVE PARISHONER

- Weekly attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.

- Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (**Treasure**)

## PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for **at least six months** prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility. **To register, please email Kyle Hall at [kyle.hall@charlestdiocese.org](mailto:kyle.hall@charlestdiocese.org)**, or you can also **register online** - scan the QR code below by opening your camera app.



### Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre- registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

### First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

### Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

### Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

### Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

# PRAYER

## FROM THE DESK OF OUR PASTORAL ADMINISTRATOR

### **Breaking the Cycle: What the Pharisee and Tax Collector Reveal About Us All**

At first glance, Jesus' parables seem like simple moral stories, but they hold profound truths that unsettle and transform us. They act as mirrors, revealing the hidden corners of our hearts. One perfect example? The parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector (Lk 18:9-14). On the surface, it's "be humble, not prideful"—simple enough, right? Not so fast. This parable is like a spiritual MRI, exposing our struggles with pride, comparison, and grace. Spoiler alert: it's not always a pretty sight. As Jesus declares, "For whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted."

From the start, Jesus sets the tone: this parable is for "those convinced of their own righteousness and who look down on others." You can almost hear Him saying, "This one's for all y'all who think you got it all together." And just like that, the trap is set. What do we do? We immediately judge the Pharisee, pat ourselves on the back for identifying with the tax collector, and walk away feeling spiritual superior. Classic Pharisee move, right? The genius of this story lies in how it forces us to see that we are both the Pharisee and the tax collector. We hold both pride and humility, self-righteousness and brokenness. Jesus isn't here to shame us—no, no, no—He's here to help us to drop the act and step into grace.

Let's unpack this. The Pharisee's prayer? It isn't really about God; it's about himself. He comes to God with a resume—fasting, tithing, living a moral life. But beneath the surface lies a subtle idolatry: the worship of the unholy trinity of me, myself, and I. His worth is built on comparison, on seeing himself as better than others—like the tax collector. In contrast, the tax collector stands at a distance, head bowed, and praying simply, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner." No excuses. No pretense. Just raw honesty and vulnerability. And you know what? That's the key—humility. Not the fake kind that says, "Oh, I'm so worthless," but the real kind that says, "Lord, I need You. I can't do this on my own."

This parable isn't just for ancient audiences – it's painfully relevant today. Let's be real: we live in a Pharisee-friendly culture. Scroll through social media for five minutes, and you'll see what I mean. We compare, compete, and judge—either inflating our sense of superiority ("at least I'm doing better than them") or drowning in feelings of inadequacy or envy ("why can't I be like them"). It's a toxic cycle of comparison that fuels the very pride and self-righteousness Jesus is calling us to confront. C.S. Lewis called pride the "anti-God state of mind." Because it blocks us from fully receiving God's mercy. But the tax collector? He shows us a better way: simple, honest prayer rooted in humility. As Sirach says, "The prayer of the lowly pierces the clouds; it does not rest till it reaches its goal nor will it withdraw till the Most High responds" (35:17). When we stop trying to fix ourselves, we make room for God's transforming love to work in us.

Faith, too often, gets twisted into a tool for superiority, judgment, or exclusion rather than a mission to love and serve humbly. Jesus calls us to reject self-righteous elitism and embrace radical mercy—the kind that forgives even those we struggle to accept. The same grace that forgave the tax collector forgives us. And when we begin to see others through God's eyes, we realize a humbling truth: we're all broken, flawed, and in desperate need of a Savior.

This parable reminds us that grace is not transactional. It can't be earned or achieved—it's a gift. The Pharisee's pride blinds him to it, while the tax collector's vulnerability makes way for transformation. And that, my friends, is the good news: God doesn't meet us at the peak of our achievements but in the depths of our need and brokenness. He sees through the masks, the comparisons, and the pretense loving us exactly as we are. Wholeness isn't about perfection; it's about letting God take our broken pieces and make something beautiful.

So here's the challenge: What's your next move? Will you keep comparing, performing, and striving? Or will you come to God with open hands and a simple prayer: "God, be merciful to me, a sinner"? That's enough. His love doesn't hinge on our worthiness—it flows from who He is. And this truth? It sets us free: free to be forgiven, to grow, and to live in the boundless, unshakable mercy of God. Stop performing. Start praying. That's where transformation begins.

### **PRAY FOR OUR MILITARY**

The men and women who serve in the armed forces do so with a sacrificial love for our country and the world. Lifting them up in prayer to our Lord must be our humble, and yet great support for them.

Lord, may your love encircle our military as they work across the world to install justice and peace for all. And be their hope through the difficulties and stress they face each day.

## Food Pantry Update

### Supporting Our Neighbors in Need

Our Food Pantry continues to grow and serve our neighbors each week, with anywhere from **160 to 190 bags distributed daily**. We are grateful to welcome new clients while continuing to support many familiar faces.

As the needs of our community increase, so do our basic supply needs. We are especially in need of:

- Vienna sausage
- Peanut butter crackers
- Fruit cups
- Bottled water

For our unhoused neighbors, we aim to provide ready-to-eat, easy-to-carry items such as:

- Instant grits or oatmeal
- Pop-Tarts or protein bars
- Pop-top cans of meat or SpaghettiOs
- Ramen noodles

In addition to donating food items, **parishioners can also help by making sandwiches at home**—a simple but meaningful way to provide quick, nourishing meals for our unhoused neighbors.

As colder weather approaches, we are also collecting **winter and comfort items** to help those in need stay warm and safe. Donations of **hats, gloves, scarves, coats, socks, blankets (dark colors preferred), sleeping bags, and lightly worn tennis shoes for both men and women** are greatly appreciated.

We also continue to collect **hygiene items** such as **soap, toothbrushes, toothpaste, and other personal care essentials**.

Your generosity allows us to meet both the physical and spiritual needs of those who come to our doors. **Thank you for helping us share Christ's love through your ongoing support of this ministry.**
