## PARISH REGISTRATION & SACRAMENTS

#### **ACTIVE PARISHONER**

- Weekly attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.
- Volunteer on regular basis (Time)
- Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**)
- Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (Treasure)

#### PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for **at least six months** prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility. **To register, please email Kyle Hall at kyle.hall@charlestondiocese.org**, or you can also <u>register online</u> – scan the QR code below by opening your camera app.



#### **Infant Baptism Class for Parents**

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre- registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

#### **First Holy Communion**

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

#### Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

#### Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

#### Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

## **PRAYER**

#### FROM THE DESK OF OUR PASTORAL ADMINISTRATOR

Where do we search for God? Let's start with a striking thought from Johann Tauler: "We must go into our house, our souls..." That's where we search for God—ironically, it's also where God searches for us. But don't expect some serene, candlelit moment of quiet reflection. The search is messy. Tauler paints a vivid picture of God "ransacking the house," tossing things aside, determined to find us. It's uncomfortable, even unsettling, but then again, real transformation rarely comes easy.

While churches and rituals hold value, they serve as signposts, not the ultimate destination. The true dwelling place of God? It's within us. Faith, after all, isn't about comfort. It's not cheap or effortless. Yes, it's a free gift from God, but it's one we must wrestle with to claim as our own. And here's the beauty of it: God isn't searching for some Instagram-filtered, polished version of us. (Spoiler alert: that version doesn't exist.) Instead, God meets us in the mess—our chaos, our raw and unpolished selves. That mutual search, that divine game of hide-and-seek, lies at the very heart of faith.

Now, let's turn to this Sunday's Gospel. Jesus enters the Temple, stepping into the Court of the Gentiles, and what does He find? A bustling marketplace. Merchants sell animals, money changers profit from pilgrims—it's chaos and exploitation in a space meant for prayer. In an unforgettable moment of righteous anger, Jesus flips tables and drives them out. But His outrage isn't just about the marketplace. He's calling out something much deeper.

Jesus warns that religion can become too comfortable—too focused on appearances, empty rituals, or even power. When that happens, it loses its soul. True worship isn't about checking boxes or performing outward piety. It's about an authentic encounter with God—one that unsettles us, changes us, and, through us, transforms the world.

And here's where it gets personal. Saint Paul reminds us, "You are the temple of God." Let that sink in: you, me, every single one of us—we are living, breathing temples of the Holy Spirit. God isn't confined to a building or some far-off heaven. He's right here, dwelling within us. But just like the Temple in today's Gospel, our hearts can become cluttered. So, what's cluttering yours? What distractions, habits, or attitudes are taking up space that belongs to God?

Materialism? Selfishness? Division? An obsession with comfort? These are the modern-day money changers of our hearts, pushing God to the edges. This Sunday's liturgy invites us to flip the tables in our own lives—clearing out the clutter and making room for God again. It's not easy, but it's worth every ounce of effort.

Here's the deeper truth: Jesus redefines what the Temple is. In the Gospel, He declares that His body is the true Temple—the meeting place of God and humanity. Through His death and resurrection, Jesus opens the door for us to become living temples of the Holy Spirit. It's a radical idea. It's an incredible gift, but also a serious responsibility.

So, what does that mean for us? As God's living temples, we're called to carry His presence to others. Our lives should reflect His love, mercy, and justice. But here's the catch: we can't give what we don't have. Before we can bring God's light to others, we need to let Him into the messy, broken, and cluttered parts of our own hearts. Only then can real transformation happen—in us and through us.

When we gather around the Eucharist, we're reminded of this sacred calling. The body and blood of Christ unite us and send us into the world as His hands and feet. We're commissioned to bring His love, service, and hope to everyone we meet—especially the poor, the vulnerable, and those most in need.

So, as we leave this place today, let's live what we've received. Let's clear the clutter, embrace our identity as living temples of the Holy Spirit, and carry God's love into a world starving for it. Because when you strip it all down, faith isn't about staying comfortable—it's about being transformed. And through that transformation, we can begin to transform the world.

#### PRAY FOR OUR MILITARY

Lord, may your love encircle our military as they work across the world to install justice and peace for all. And be their hope through the difficulties and stress they face each day.
