PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for **at least six months** prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility. **To register, please email Kyle Hall at kyle.hall@charlestondiocese.org**, or you can also <u>register online</u> – scan the QR code below by opening your camera app.



Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre- registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

PRAYER

FROM THE DESK OF OUR PASTORAL ADMINISTRATOR

As the liturgical year begins with Advent, we are ushered into a profound paradox: to anticipate eternity while fully embracing the present. Advent is not merely a countdown to Christmas; it is a sacred invitation to awaken, remain alert, and live with intentionality.

The early Christians captured the essence of this season with three powerful Greek words that continue to resonate deeply:

- παρουσία (parousia): The Lord's coming—always near, always imminent—reminding us of God's active presence in every moment.
- ἐγείρω (egeirō): Wake up! A call to shake off spiritual complacency and engage with the deeper purposes of God.
- γρηγορέω (grēgoreō): Be watchful! A reminder to stay attentive to God's movements, even in the ordinary and unexpected.

Jesus' words, "Stay awake! For at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come," are not meant to provoke fear or an obsessive focus on apocalyptic scenarios. Rather, they are a gentle yet urgent reminder to live with purpose, hope, and readiness. Advent is not about stockpiling fear or fixating on the unknown; it is about creating space in our hearts and lives for God to reveal Himself—often in the most surprising ways.

Paul echoes this vision, urging believers to cast off the darkness of sin and live as children of the light. Balancing the demands of daily life with a vivid anticipation of Christ's return lies at the heart of the Christian journey. The timing of His coming remains a mystery, as sudden and unexpected as a thief in the night. Jesus warns us against the numbing effects of routine and distraction, which can blind us to the sacredness woven into the ordinary moments of life—even in the chaos of shopping mall parking lots or last-minute gift-wrapping mishaps.

Are there places in your life where spiritual complacency has taken root? How might God be calling you to awaken to His presence today? Henri Nouwen reminds us that waiting during Advent is an act of faith—a trust that God's future is already unfolding. Yet how often do we live as if lulled into a spiritual slumber, disconnected from this deeper reality? While we may profess faith, our choices and priorities often stray far from Christ's radical call to love, serve, and transform the world. Advent stirs us from this slumber, calling us to open our eyes and hearts to God's ever-present reality.

Vigilance is not about anxiously scanning the horizon for signs of the end but about cultivating a profound sensitivity to God's movements today. It is about hearing the cries of the suffering, discovering God's boundless love in creation, and responding with compassion. Without this awareness, we risk becoming blind to the transformative power of the Gospel. In the parable of judgment, the unprepared ask, "Lord, when did we see you hungry, thirsty, a stranger, naked, sick, or imprisoned, and not help you?" Advent calls us to see with renewed eyes and respond with open hearts.

Waiting during Advent is not passive but active. Isaiah calls us to beat swords into plowshares, transforming conflict into care and division into unity. Peace is not merely the result of Christ's coming; it is also the means by which we prepare for His arrival. Paul challenges us to cast off the darkness of rivalry, envy, and indulgence, choosing instead to live as children of the light. Matthew reminds us that readiness is found not in grand gestures but in the ordinariness of daily life. Advent teaches us to discover the sacred in the mundane, to find God's presence in the rhythms of ordinary moments, and to respond with faith, hope, and love.

As we enter this season of Advent, reflect on this: Where is God inviting you to notice His presence in the ordinary? What areas of spiritual slumber is He calling you to awaken from? How can you embody hope, peace, and compassion as you prepare for Christ's arrival?

May Advent awaken us to the sacred, inspire us to live with purpose, and remind us that the God who once came in a manger still comes to meet us in the messiness of our lives. Let us stay awake—not out of fear, but with joyful expectation—because the ending of this story is far more glorious than we could ever imagine.

PRAY FOR OUR MILITARY



Revitalizing Our Playground: Safe Spaces for Joyful Play

Our school playground is like a time capsule, filled with memories of childhood. But sadly, some of the playground equipment is old and broken, making it unsafe for kids to play. We're committed to creating a space where students can explore God's creation through active, imaginative play—essential for their physical, social, and spiritual development.

Updating Our STEM Curriculum: Igniting Wonder in God's World

In line with our mission to form faithful innovators, we're updating our STEM program to equip students with tools for scientific inquiry and mathematical reasoning—skills that reveal the beauty and order of creation. This renewal focuses on hands-on learning that aligns with Catholic values of wonder, collaboration, and ethical problem-solving.

- Key Components:
 - FOSS Next Generation Science Curriculum (Grades K-5): Developed by the Lawrence Hall of Science at UC Berkeley, this research-based program engages students in authentic scientific practices. It leverages natural wonder for observable phenomena, aligned with Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS). Students won't just learn about science—they'll do science: observing, testing ideas, and applying knowledge to real-world problems. As the FOSS philosophy states, "Science is a discovery activity, a process for producing new knowledge," making it accessible and equitable for every child. Lessons use local, relevant phenomena to build deeper understanding of the natural and designed worlds, bridging content knowledge with active participation.

o Updated Mathematics Curriculum and Professional Development:

- We're adopting a new math framework paired with training from The Number Lab, an organization dedicated to
 ending "impoverished math experiences" through innovative, practice-based learning. This includes a three-day
 [Co]Lab seminar at Long-View Micro School, where teachers will:
 - Strengthen mathematical reasoning and problem-solving.
 - Build a math-rich classroom culture through collaboration.
 - Explore Universal Design for Learning (UDL) to support diverse learners.
 - Foster critical thinking, communication, and creativity—embracing math as a "generative perspective" that promotes growth mindsets.
 - This empowers teachers to create positive math experiences, helping students see numbers as a reflection of divine order.
- Timeline: Professional development and curriculum introduction in early summer 2026, with full classroom implementation starting fall 2026.
- Funding Goal: \$25,000 to jumpstart this 18-month renewal in mathematics and natural science.
