## PARISH REGISTRATION & SACRAMENTS

#### **ACTIVE PARISHONER**

- Weekly attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.
- Volunteer on regular basis (**Time**)
- Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**)
- Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (Treasure)

#### PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for **at least six months** prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility. **To register, please email Kyle Hall at kyle.hall@charlestondiocese.org**, or you can also <u>register online</u> – scan the QR code below by opening your camera app.



#### **Infant Baptism Class for Parents**

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre- registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

#### **First Holy Communion**

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

#### Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

#### Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

#### Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

#### Unshakable Joy in a Broken World: Rediscovering Light and Hope This Advent Season

In a world weighed down by brokenness and uncertainty, the third week of Advent invites us to pause and rediscover joy—a deep, unshakable longing etched into every human heart. But let's be honest: What does joy truly mean in the midst of chaos? Can such enduring joy still exist? Advent offers its quiet yet resolute answer: Yes, it can. Trust me.

True joy isn't found in fleeting pleasures. A new gadget, a social media "like," or a momentary distraction may offer a brief escape, but they often leave us feeling emptier than before. True joy, however, is a wellspring of strength—anchored in trust, sustained by love, and fueled by the unshakable assurance that our lives hold a deeper purpose. As Pierre Teilhard de Chardin put it, "Joy is the infallible sign of the presence of God." This joy runs deep. It's not shallow or superficial but resilient, whispering in our darkest moments, "God is here. This is not the end of the story."

Contrary to popular belief, joy and sorrow are not opposites but intimately connected. We grieve deeply because we love deeply. We long for meaning, yet we wrestle with doubt. We strive to do good, but we often stumble. This tension is not a flaw; it's what makes us fully alive. Jesus' life vividly demonstrates this paradox. His mission brought healing and hope, yet His path led through suffering and the cross. His resurrection didn't erase the pain—it transformed it. Likewise, Christian joy doesn't ignore struggle. It grows through it, deepening and strengthening. Advent reminds us that joy doesn't deny the darkness; it dares to light a candle within it.

Practicing joy doesn't mean pretending everything is fine. It's about trusting that God is at work, even when life feels uncertain. John the Baptist exemplifies this kind of joy—not one rooted in applause or recognition, but in pointing to Christ and embracing his unique role in God's story. Freed from the pressure to be the hero, John's joy was humble yet profound.

As Dr. Jacqui Lewis reminds us, joy is vital for the human spirit to thrive. Without it, we risk being consumed by fear, resentment, and despair. Joy isn't meant to remain private; it's designed to flow outward, bringing hope to others. Advent challenges us to step into the broken places of our world—workplaces where people feel invisible, homes strained by conflict, and communities fractured by fear—and bring light. Joy, when lived out, transforms, heals, and unites. As theologian Barbara Holmes says, "The greatest antidote to depression and oppression is joy. Joy comes during worship, fellowship, and even crisis." This season challenges us to create spaces where joy can flourish, even when we struggle to find it ourselves. Living joyfully means participating in Christ's mission in tangible ways—affirming the dignity of the poor, comforting the brokenhearted, and helping the oppressed find freedom. Even small acts—a smile, a listening ear, or a heartfelt "How are you really doing?"—can carry profound weight in a world distracted by the glow of screens.

This Advent, the question isn't, "How can I feel more joyful?" but rather, "What is my life aiming toward?" Joy isn't something we chase; it's the fruit of a life rooted in Christ. Jesus stepped into our messy, unfinished story to bring light to the darkness and joy to the brokenness. And this joy? It isn't meant to be hidden. It's meant to overflow, touching the lives of those who feel forgotten, burdened, or overwhelmed by life's noise. So this Advent, dare to carry the light of Christ. Be a person of joy—not by denying life's struggles, but by proclaiming through your words and actions: God is here. Joy is alive. And that changes everything.

#### PRAY FOR OUR MILITARY

The men and women who serve in the armed forces do so with a sacrificial love for our country and the world. Lifting them up in prayer to our Lord must be our humble, and yet great support for them.

Lord, may your love encircle our military as they work across the world to install justice and peace for all. And be their hope through the difficulties and stress they face each day.




### **Advent Day of Service Highlights**
