# PARISH REGISTRATION & SACRAMENTS

## PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for **at least six months** prior to reception of these

Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility. **To register**, email **Kyle Hall at [kyle.hall@charlestondiocese.org](mailto:kyle.hall@charlestondiocese.org)**, or you can also **register online** using the QR code below by opening your app.



### Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre- registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

### First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

### Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

### Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

### Prayer for Our Parish

As this year draws to a close, I lift my heart in gratitude to God—for the countless blessings we have received, for the strength to endure life's trials, and for the gift of our parish, St. Anthony. I am especially thankful for its rich and resilient history, deeply rooted in African American faith and spirituality, and for its Franciscan heart, always open to the poor, the forgotten, and the overlooked. This legacy calls us to see Christ in both joy and suffering, reminding us of His constant presence in the concrete realities of our lives—especially in the lives of those most in need.

Our parish is a beautiful tapestry woven from individuals of many cultures, traditions, and backgrounds. Yet, in Christ, we are one family, one Body, united in love and diversity. Together, by God's grace, we are shaping the future of our parish, responding to His call in the here and now.

Our parish will reflect God's love, if I reflect it:

It will be welcoming, if I welcome—with a smile, a warm greeting, and an open heart, especially to those carrying heavy burdens or little hope.

It will be friendly, if I am friendly.

It will be holy, if I strive for holiness.

It will grow and transform, if I allow God to stretch my heart, challenge my assumptions, and draw me closer to the Gospel.

It will stand with the poor, the wounded, and the forgotten, if I choose to see Christ in them, to approach them without judgment, and to walk beside them with compassion and love.

It will do great works, if I serve with love and purpose—not only preserving what is good, but courageously embracing the new paths the Holy Spirit opens before us, so we may better serve those in need. Our parish will be prayerful, if I pray—for the grace to listen deeply, to understand with humility, and to discern together how God is calling us to respond to the injustices of our time.

It will be generous, if I give generously—of my time, talents, and resources, especially for those in our community and beyond who are most affected by hardship and struggle. It will draw others into worship, if I invite and accompany them—helping them feel at home, no matter their culture, language, or background, and walking with them in the concrete circumstances of their lives.

May our parish be a beacon of light:

A place where diverse cultures are welcomed as gifts of the Holy Spirit;

Where the poor, the hungry, the lonely, and the forgotten find a seat at the table and a family in Christ;

Where many hearts are lifted in one prayer, and unity is forged through respect, patience, compassion, and mercy.

And may this transformation begin with me. For I, who help shape my parish, must first embody these same gifts:

Ready to be changed and challenged,

To embrace those on the margins,

And to follow wherever Christ leads.

Therefore, with God's help, I dedicate myself today to becoming what I hope my parish will be:

A place where all are welcomed and cherished;

Where we respond to the cries of our time with courageous, self-giving love;

And where we live as one Body in Christ, united in diversity and in love.

# ST. ANTHONY SCHOOL UPDATE

## A Heartfelt Thank You from St. Anthony of Padua Catholic School

Dear Parish Family of St. Anthony of Padua,

As we gather for worship on this first weekend of the New Year, following the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God on January 1st, I extend our deepest gratitude to you, our generous parish community, for the extraordinary blessings poured out on our school during Advent. Your love made Christmas a season of true joy and dignity for so many.

- **Christmas Gifts for Families in Need:** Through your selfless contributions, 15 families in our school community—many with multiple children—received thoughtful gifts. This allowed parents to create a merry Christmas Day, restoring a sense of hope and normalcy amid hardships. Your generosity reflected the Gospel's call to care for the vulnerable.

- **Christmas Boutique:** A dedicated group of parishioners organized a delightful boutique where every student could shop for meaningful gifts for their families and loved ones. This hands-on experience formed our children in the \*\*art of gift-giving\*\*, teaching them selflessness and the joy of loving others as Christ loves us.

- **School Performances:** Thank you to all who attended our Christmas performance of Disney's Frozen and the School Christmas Concert. Your presence filled our children with pride and encouragement, strengthening the bonds between school and parish.

These acts are not mere transactions; they are signs of the parish's living faith, sustaining our mission to evangelize and form young hearts.

### A Commitment to Authentic Catholic Education

Since arriving as principal in June, I have sought to emphasize our school's sacred task: evangelizing students and forming them in the Christian intellectual tradition. This vision draws directly from the Church's teaching, especially the second reading from the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God: St. Paul's Epistle to the Galatians (4:4-7).

When the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, to ransom those under the law, so that we might receive adoption as sons.

Here, St. Paul proclaims the kerygma—the core proclamation of encounter with Christ, inviting faith and discipleship. The Incarnation launches our salvation: in Christ, we receive adoption as sons of the Father, proven by the Holy Spirit who enables us to cry, "Abba, Father!" Christian education cooperates with this grace, forming the true and perfect Christian—Christ Himself—in those regenerated by Baptism.

As the Church teaches, Christian education embraces the whole of human life: physical and spiritual, intellectual and moral, individual, domestic, and social. It elevates, regulates, and perfects all in light of Christ's example, producing the supernatural man who thinks, judges, and acts consistently with reason illumined by faith. This is the adoptive sonship St. Paul describes—a life of freedom, truth, and love.

### The Five Essential Marks of Catholic Schools: A Roadmap for Happiness and Holiness

Mission-driven Catholic schools like ours offer what no secular model can: formation in the confidence and joy of being loved beyond measure by God, who draws children to Himself through Creation's beauty, goodness, truth, order, and mystery. Our aim is to raise a new generation of students who are faithful, free, and joyful—whose minds earnestly seek truth, hearts ardently desire goodness, and imaginations are captivated by beauty. Parents long to give their children the best start in life, and Catholic schools rooted in the Church's tradition can meet that need most completely.

#### Drawing from Church documents, Archbishop J. Michael Miller identified five essential marks for authentically Catholic education:

**1. Inspired by a Supernatural Vision:** Education transmits not just facts, but a coherent vision of life rooted in Christ's liberating truth, restoring culture's grasp of objective reality and duties to God and neighbor.

**2. Founded on a Christian Anthropology:** The person is central—spiritual, intellectual, emotional, social, and physical—formed for beatitude (ultimate happiness in God), integrating faith, reason, virtue, and sacramental worldview.

**3. Animated by Communion and Community:** Schools build a Gospel-permeated climate of dignity, solidarity, dialogue, and mutual respect, rejecting mass education for personalized growth.

**4. Imbued with a Catholic Worldview Throughout the Curriculum:** No separation between learning and formation; all subjects reveal faith's light, avoiding secular reductionism that erases God from Creation and dulls wonder.

**5. Sustained by Gospel Witness:** Teachers and staff live as witnesses, with prayer, liturgy (especially Eucharist and Penance), and service marking school life, fostering justice, solidarity, and holiness.

Secular curricula undermine these marks, flattening knowledge into forgettable skills and eroding faith. Catholic education, by contrast, unveils Creation's unity and purpose.
