PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for **at least six months** prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility. **To register, please email Kyle Hall at kyle.hall@charlestdiocese.org**, or you can also [register online](#) - scan the QR code below by opening your camera app.



Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre- registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Family in Christ, I am deeply grateful for each and every one of you who form the heart of our vibrant parish family. Together, we are a beautiful tapestry of faith, love, and service, reflecting God's presence among us. It is with joy and excitement that I share some of the initiatives and opportunities that are shaping and strengthening our parish in the year ahead.

1. Leadership & Evangelization Initiatives

Divine Renovation Coaching

Our Divine Renovation leadership coaching sessions began last Thursday. Over the course of six weeks, these online meetings will help us grow as a mission-focused and vibrant parish, centered on evangelization and outreach.

Alpha Leadership Coaching

On January 14, Alpha leadership coaching will commence at St. Mary Magdalen Church. This program is designed to equip and empower us to accompany those who are seeking, questioning, or returning to the faith, and to invite them into a deeper relationship with Jesus.

Parish Team Retreat – “Leadership and Teamwork: An Everest Reward”

On January 16, our parish team will gather with the Poor Clares for a retreat focused on prayer, communion, and teamwork. Together, we will seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit and renew our shared vision for the future of St. Anthony Parish.

2. Parish Structure & Ministry Roles

We are currently revising and clarifying ministry roles to better serve the needs of our parish. This restructuring is guided by the Divine Renovation framework and is intended to foster a more pastoral, missionary, and collaborative approach. Key updates include:

- **Job descriptions** tailored to the specific needs and realities of our parish community.
- **A clearer, more detailed structure** for leadership and ministry, helping us work together in unity and purpose.
- **Plans to appoint a liturgy coordinator**, ensuring our celebrations are reverent, well-organized, and spiritually enriching for all.

We are also reorganizing and updating our parish database and online giving systems. Our goal is to transition toward a **single, integrated platform** that will allow us to better understand our parish demographics, respond more effectively to ministry needs, and plan more strategically for evangelization and outreach.

3. Diocesan Alignment & Special Events

Via Fidelis Pastoral Program

In alignment with our bishop's Via Fidelis pastoral program, we are integrating its monthly activities into our parish life and walking together with the wider diocesan Church. On Ash Wednesday, we begin the Year of Catechesis, a special diocesan-wide focus on deepening our understanding and living out of the Catholic faith.

Evangelization Rally

We are excited to participate in an Evangelization Rally marking the close of the first year of the bishop's pastoral plan. This gathering will take place on Saturday, January 17, in Columbia (10:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.).

African American Diocesan Pastoral Plan & Black History Month Celebration

As part of the African American Diocesan Pastoral Plan, we will join the Black History Month celebration at St. Patrick Church in Charleston on February 14 at 4:15 p.m. All are warmly invited to attend this meaningful event as we honor the rich faith, history, and contributions of our African American brothers and sisters.

4. Vision, Mission & Evangelization

At every level of leadership, we are reviewing and refining the vision and mission of St. Anthony Parish. Our desire is that every ministry, structure, and activity clearly reflects the heart of our Catholic faith:

- **Obedying Jesus' command** to “preach the Gospel and baptize them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.”
- **Recognizing that the Church exists to evangelize**, to joyfully proclaim and witness to the Good News.
- **Empowering all the baptized** to live out their call to holiness and mission, each according to their gifts and state in life.

As a parish, we are not only called to gather for worship but also to **go forth and share Christ with others**—in our families, workplaces, neighborhoods, and the wider community.

5. Upcoming Spiritual Opportunities

Lenten Retreat – “You Are Blessed, Broken, and Sacred”

Please mark your calendars for our Lenten retreat on **March 14**. This retreat will invite us into a deeper experience of conversion, healing, and preparation for Easter, as we reflect on how God meets us in our blessedness, our brokenness, and our sacred dignity.

Lenten Confession Times

To provide more opportunities for spiritual renewal, we will offer **additional confession times every Monday during Lent, from 5:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.** I encourage you to make the Sacrament of Reconciliation a central part of your Lenten journey.

Pentecost Vigil Celebration

Plans are underway for a **special Pentecost Vigil celebration**. Together, we will call upon the Holy Spirit to renew us as a parish committed to missionary discipleship, unity, and bold witness in our world.

6. Pews & Flooring Project

It is with great joy that I share the wonderful news regarding our pews and flooring project. Thanks to the **extraordinary generosity of two anonymous donors**, we now have the funds to cover the **entire cost of the project**. ST. ANTHONY SCHOOL UPDATE

Dear Parishioners of St. Anthony of Padua,

As we move from the Solemnity of the Epiphany into Ordinary Time, the Church calls us to reflect on Christ's light revealed to all nations. Pope Benedict XVI expressed this powerfully:

"The Epiphany foretells the universal openness of the Church, her call to evangelize all peoples. But the Epiphany also tells us how the Church realizes this mission: by reflecting the light of Christ and proclaiming his Word. Christians are called to imitate the service that the star rendered to the Magi. We must shine out as children of light, so as to attract all people to the beauty of the Kingdom of God. And to those who seek the truth, we must offer the Word of God, which leads us to recognize in Jesus 'the true God and eternal life' (1 Jn 5:20)."

This message aligns directly with our school's mission at St. Anthony of Padua Catholic School. We are dedicated to evangelizing the next generation by reflecting Christ's light in education that leads families and students to the truth, goodness, and beauty of God's Kingdom. Our strategic renewal supports this through our academic program – forming students who are faithful, free, and joyful.

Progress in Strategic Renewal

Effective Catholic liberal education integrates faith, reason, and virtue into daily lessons and practices. At its core the mission of the Catholic school is to bring the young men and women in our care to encounter Jesus Christ and the truths of our Catholic faith through their intellectual, spiritual, moral, and human formation. Our efforts partner with families to help students meet Christ, develop virtue, and recognize their purpose as God's image-bearers—male and female—destined for eternal life. We address modern relativism by affirming truth as the foundation of true freedom and human fulfillment.

Key faculty formation initiatives, launched in the Fall and continuing through the final two quarters, focus on:

- **The mission of Catholic education**, studied via Archbishop J. Michael Miller's *The Holy See's Teaching on Catholic Schools*.
- **Discipleship as education's goal**, explored in Erasmo Leiva-Merikakis's *The Way of the Disciple*.

Faculty and Community Commitments

Teachers bear primary responsibility for fostering our distinctive Christian school climate, both individually and as a community. The Congregation for Catholic Education states:

The religious dimension of the school climate is expressed through the celebration of Christian values **in Word and Sacrament, in individual behaviour, in friendly and harmonious interpersonal relationships, and in a ready availability**. Through this daily witness, the students will come to appreciate the uniqueness of the environment to which their youth has been entrusted. If it is not present, then there is little left which can make the school Catholic (*The Religious Dimension of Education in a Catholic School*, n. 26).

In my first semester here at St. Anthony of Padua I have invested my time and energy into the work of clarifying the school's mission in the heart of the Church. The entire program of faculty formation this year centers on answering the questions: *Who are we? What are we called to be?* The fundamental principle is the conviction that being (who we are) is prior to *doing*. Our faculty formation prepares teachers to model this reality, building an environment where:

- **Word and Sacrament** shape daily life through integrated prayer, Liturgy of the Hours, and Eucharistic adoration.
- **Personal conduct** demonstrates doctrine and joyful faith, with Catholic teachers upholding Church teaching and others respecting the mission.
- **Relationships** promote charity, dignity, and family dialogue on key issues like life, race, and gender, guided by Church doctrine.
- **Availability** reinforces pro-life values, a sacramental worldview, and formation oriented toward heaven.

The entire community—parents, staff, and parishioners—must collaborate to preserve our Catholic identity. Together, we can draw more families to Christ.
