PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for **at least six months** prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility. **To register, please email Kyle Hall at kyle.hall@charlestdioocese.org**, or you can also [register online](#) - scan the QR code below by opening your camera app.



Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre- registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

FROM THE DESK OF OUR PASTORAL ADMINISTRATOR

When Obedience Becomes Joy

"Blessed are they who follow the law of the Lord." We say it. We sing it. We long for it. And if we are honest, many of us have also felt quietly exhausted by it. The Psalm hides a question: Blessed, yes. But how? How do we live God's commandments without turning faith into pressure, anxiety, comparison, or a spiritual scoreboard?

Here is the shift that changes everything: God's commandments are not the price of admission into God's family. They are the family resemblance that starts to show when you already belong. Grace comes first, and grace reshapes us.

Think of a child who slowly picks up a parent's gestures, tone of voice, even the way they laugh. Not because the child studied it. Because they lived close to it.

A good parent teaches the child how to live in the home without harming themselves or others. In the same way, when God gives commandments, he is not saying, "Prove you deserve me." He is saying, "You are mine. Learn my way of life, so you can share my joy."

That leads to a searching question: Do I treat the commandments as a path that forms me into love, or as a scoreboard that lets me rank myself over others?

Because once faith becomes a scoreboard, it quietly produces something ugly. Not holiness, but an orphan spirit. A way of living as if you are on your own. Everything becomes performance and comparison. Self-protection. Control. Keeping up appearances. You try to earn what was meant to be received.

And "blessed" is not the prize for perfect rule-keeping. "Blessed" is what happens when your life becomes aligned, when what you claim to love, what you choose, and who you are in secret begin to point in the same direction.

So if blessedness is not about keeping score, what does it look like in daily life? Sirach gives us a clue. He says that God sets life and death, good and evil, before us. Not to threaten us, but to tell us the truth: your choices are real. They matter. They shape you.

So consider another question: Where do I say, "I had no choice," when what I really mean is, "I had a choice, and I did not want the cost"? There is a difference between "I could not" and "I would not." God knows the difference, not to crush us, but to call us back to freedom.

Then, in the Gospel, Jesus says he did not come to abolish the law, but to fulfill it. To fill it with love (Mt 5:17). He reveals what it was always aiming at: communion. Not an ethical program, but a relationship—with Christ, and through Christ, with one another.

Jesus is not saying, "Forget the commandments." He is saying, "You thought this was about managing behavior. It is about becoming a certain kind of person."

After all, it is possible to keep every rule on paper and still be cold, sharp-tongued, quietly cruel, and proud.

So Jesus does something bracing. He takes the obvious sins and traces them back to their roots. Murder rarely begins with violence. It often begins with anger you feed instead of face, contempt that says, "You are beneath me," with the inner habit of writing someone off, and even the secret satisfaction of imagining their failure.

Adultery rarely begins in a hotel room. It begins when you train your imagination to treat a person like an object, when you feed the habit of using instead of honoring them.

In other words, holiness is dealing with the spark before it becomes a fire. The real question is: What am I letting live quietly in my heart that would horrify me if it showed up in my actions, given enough time to grow? Don't answer that quickly. Sit with it.

And if Jesus is serious about the heart, then the Eucharist is not abstract. Communion with Christ is meant to create communion with each other. We cannot receive one while refusing the other. That is why the Sign of Peace is not a polite intermission. It is Jesus saying, gently but honestly: you cannot claim union with Me while clinging to hatred for the person near you.

This does not mean reconciliation is instant, easy, or perfectly restored. It means reconciliation becomes a direction. Because resentment does not punish the person who hurt you. It just moves into your chest, makes itself at home, and you pay the rent. Jesus offers something better. Not denial. Not pretending it did not hurt, but freedom that begins in the heart and moves outward.

So today, may the Lord give us the grace not only to follow commandments, but to fulfill them with a love that goes all the way to the root. And in that love, quiet, steady, real may we discover what the Psalm promised all along: blessedness. Amen.




