PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for **at least six months** prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility. **To register, please email Kyle Hall at kyle.hall@charlestdiocese.org**, or you can also **register online** - scan the QR code below by opening your camera app.



Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre-registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

Beloved Before You Become

Yakov Smirnoff tells a story about walking through an American grocery store in shock. He sees powdered milk with the instructions, "Just add water." Then powdered orange juice with the same directions. And then he notices baby powder and thinks, "What a country!" The joke lands because it touches a hope many of us quietly carry. What if change were that simple? Add one ingredient. Skip the process. Wake up different.

But the changes we want most, patience, courage, honesty, faith, peace, do not come in powder form. We chase quick fixes not only because we are impatient, but because we are anxious. When you feel unsafe inside, you reach for control. And speed can feel like control.

So we start treating spiritual growth like a drive through order. God, give me a better attitude, a stronger marriage, a little confidence, and extra peace to go. Yet God does not do instant transformation. Not because He is slow, but because real love refuses to change us from a distance. Love comes close. Love touches what is real. Love stays long enough to remake us.

This is the heart of Lent. Not God being harsh, but God being kind. Lent tells the truth gently. You do not have to manage your way into wholeness. You do not have to hustle your way into peace. The quiet morning. The prayer you repeat even when you feel nothing. The small act of restraint. These are not punishments. They are invitations to stop performing and start receiving.

And notice how often God begins this way. Not with a demand, but with an invitation that widens your horizon.

Think of Abraham. God interrupts an ordinary life with a simple instruction: "Step outside. Look up. Count the stars." God is not only giving him information. God is giving him a horizon, something larger than his fear, larger than what he can control. Part of being human is learning to lift your eyes again, to remember there is more than the tight circle of habits and deadlines.

Centuries later, on another mountain, we see the same pattern in the Transfiguration. God does not begin with a checklist. He does not start with "Try harder." He begins with identity. "This is my Beloved Son." Then comes direction. "Listen to Him."

Real change does not begin with pushing harder. It begins with being safe enough to tell the truth. Love is not the finish line. Love is the ground under your feet.

Peter does what many of us would do. He tries to trap the moment. "Let's stay here. Let's build tents. Let's keep the glow." But God does not let them stay on the mountain. The mountain is not the destination. It is preparation. The glory is real, but it is not given as an escape. It is given as strength for the valley, for suffering, for carrying the cross.

Transformation is not a shortcut around reality. It is the slow learning of how to meet God inside reality.

So ask yourself: where are you demanding instant results right now? Where are you trying to buy in a moment what can only be built over time? What might God be asking you to trust Him with today?

Maybe the ordinary moments you keep dismissing, the laundry, the traffic, the budget talk, the awkward apology, the waiting room, the hard bedtime, are not interruptions to your spiritual life. Maybe they are the classroom.

I catch myself doing this more than I want to admit. I treat God like a vending machine, hoping that if I press the right buttons, peace will drop into my hands and I will not have to wait. But transformation rarely starts with fireworks. It starts like a seed. Quiet. Buried. Real.

So step outside. Count the stars. Trust the slow work. Remember that you are Beloved. And most importantly, listen to Him. And trust the slow work of God.

PRAY FOR OUR MILITARY

2026-2027 Application & Financial Aid Process

St. Anthony of Padua Catholic School provides a Catholic education with clear tuition rates, enrollment fees, and a structured financial aid process for the 2026-2027 academic year. Families benefit from standard and Catholic family rates, alongside opportunities through the ESTF program and school-based aid. All scholarships apply to the full published tuition first, with no cash refunds issued for ESTF awards.

Application, Testing, and Enrollment Fees

Returning families are encouraged to re-enroll early to secure the lower fee.

Catholic Family Discount Criteria:

The Catholic Family Discount is given to Catholic families residing in the Diocese of Charleston whose active practice of the Catholic faith is verified by a pastor or parochial administrator of a parish or mission in the Diocese. Active practice aligns with the precepts of the Church, which guarantee the indispensable minimum in the spirit of prayer and moral effort for growth in love of God and neighbor (CCC 2041). These precepts include:

- Attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation and rest from servile labor.
- Receive the sacrament of Reconciliation at least once a year.
- Receive Holy Eucharist at least during the Easter season.
- Observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church.
- Help provide for the needs of the Church.

Financial Aid Process and Eligibility

To maximize affordability, families desiring financial aid are required to:

- Apply promptly to the ESTF program (Empowerment Scholarship for Educational Choice) and St. Anthony of Padua FACTS Grant & Aid to assess eligibility. Funds are likely to be unavailable after March 1, 2026.
- Provide verification of ESTF award or waitlist status to the school.
- School-based aid covers only the need exceeding the \$7,634 ESTF scholarship amount, based solely on financial need—not allocation choices.
- Families without an ESTF award (with waitlist verification) remain eligible for tuition discounts and potential school-based aid, though funds are limited and not guaranteed.
