PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for **at least six months** prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility. **To register, please email Kyle Hall at kyle.hall@charlestdiocese.org**, or you can also [register online](#) - scan the QR code below by opening your camera app.



Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre-registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

FROM THE DESK OF OUR PASTORAL ADMINISTRATOR

What Changes Because You Were Here?

A teacher once asked a boy to define salt. The boy paused, thought hard, and finally said, salt is what makes fries taste good when you sprinkle it on.

It's a simple answer. But it opens a bigger question: what happens when we are "sprinkled" into the world? When we step into a room, a conversation, a workplace, a family, do we draw out what's good? Do people leave steadier, encouraged, more whole? Or do we leave an aftertaste of bitterness?

In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus reaches for two everyday images—salt and light—to describe the mission of His followers. Ordinary things. Extraordinary purpose.

Salt does more than add flavor. It preserves. It slows decay. And throughout the Old Testament, salt shows up in worship and cleansing, even in practical healing. So when Jesus says, "You are the salt of the earth," He isn't handing out a compliment. He's giving a calling: be the kind of people whose presence preserves what is good, clarifies what is true, and brings healing where life is hurting.

And salt has another quiet power: it gives itself away. It disappears into whatever it touches. It dissolves, yet its influence remains. That's discipleship. A life poured out so others can live more fully. As theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer put it, "The church is the church only when it exists for others."

But here's a less obvious side of salt: salt also stings. If you've ever had a cut on your hand and touched salt, you know it. Sometimes the presence of a faithful disciple doesn't just "improve the flavor"—it irritates what's infected. Not because we're harsh, but because truth has a way of touching tender places. Real healing often starts with honesty, confession, repentance, repair. Salt isn't always comfortable but it can be merciful. Then Jesus speaks about light.

Light is meant to be seen. It helps people find their way. It exposes what's hidden, warns of danger, and brings warmth. Faith, then, was never meant to be tucked away, toned down, or treated like a private hobby. A lamp under a basket helps no one.

To feel how bold these images were for Jesus' first listeners, picture their world. Even today, traveling north from Jerusalem toward Shechem, you can still spot clay ovens near homes.

In many villages, ovens were shared. Wood was scarce. So people used what they had for fuel, including animal dung. Some historians describe dung being mixed, shaped into patties, and dried for burning, sometimes with salt involved in producing stronger heat. However the details played out from place to place, the point still lands: Jesus' metaphor wasn't abstract. It was Practical. Close to the hands and homes of ordinary people.

So Jesus isn't only saying, "Be pleasant." He's saying, be catalytic—the kind of presence that helps what is good catch fire: compassion, truth, mercy, courage. And when His disciples live that way, they inevitably become light.

Jesus lived it first. His presence ignited hearts. His life made God visible. But He also knew the pressures His followers would face.

One temptation is to hide—to stay quiet in public spaces, to shrug at injustice, to tell ourselves it isn't our problem, to assume the world doesn't want what God offers.

The other temptation follows close behind: hidden long enough, faith goes bland. It loses its distinctiveness. It stops shaping the world and starts blending into it. We learn the talk. We don't live the walk.

Yet God's kingdom isn't about being vaguely nice or offering the occasional good deed. Discipleship is a deeper invitation: to follow Jesus in ways that push against the cultural current, to let God change us from the inside out, until our lives reflect Him in the real world.

So here's the question again: What happens when you are sprinkled into the world? When your life bumps into real people, real problems, real wounds, do you bring warmth and healing? Do you slow decay? Do you make truth clearer, and goodness easier to grow?

This calling is anything but ordinary. And that's exactly why it matters. Because the world has plenty of opinions. It's short of light.

PRAY FOR OUR MILITARY

Lord, may your love encircle our military as they work across the world to install justice and peace for all. And be their hope through the difficulties and stress they face each day.

It has none of the external brilliant dramatic quality that makes the soldier's and statesman's career attractive, and as its material remuneration is relatively scanty, and the chance of promotion to a lucrative position is almost excluded, it can make little impression on an age whose watchwords are exterior success and material progress. Still, the teacher's mission is one of the greatest importance while touched with sublimity. It is in a way a "priestly" office, for the material on which the teacher works is the mind, the immortal soul of man; his object is truly "sacerdotal," namely to consecrate these souls to their Creator, to make them more God-like in wisdom and moral goodness. The teacher is also entrusted with the destinies of society; the children and youths whom he now trains will one day be the heads of families, the parents of a new generation, the men that powerfully influence public opinion for good or ill, in the press and from the platform, the citizens whose vote will make or mar their country. Surely, this is a profession that deserves the enthusiasm of noble hearts and the absorbing interest of the ablest minds."
