

FR. EMERSON'S WEEKEND REFLECTION

The Place You Hide Is Where He Sits

A very thirsty man wanders through the desert until he finally spots a well. He drags himself to it, hauls the bucket up with the last of his strength, and cries, "Water! Water!" And from the bottom, a voice answers, "Where? Where?"

The sting of the story is familiar: the thirst is real, but the water feels elusive. Sometimes we ache for life and don't know where to turn. Sometimes we return to the same dry places, lowering the bucket again and again, bargaining with ourselves, *Maybe this time.* And hope keeps whispering, *Try again, even when the rope comes up light.*

That is why today's Gospel takes us to a well. A well exposes the ache we can't quiet silence. And this well reveals us something even more astonishing: God has a thirst, too. The God who carved the oceans and fed rivers is thirsty - for you.

This story is also about what happens when grace meets someone who has survived by disappearing. A woman. Scarred by broken relationships, by whispered judgments, by a shame that sticks to the skin. She comes to the well at noon, the hottest hour, because noon has no witnesses. No questions.

Some of us know about that hour. That "avoid everybody o'clock." And into that hidden hour comes Jesus. He steps right into her noon. And He sits down. He is shockingly vulnerable. He speaks from weakness, not from power: "Give me drink." Not scolding. Just a need offered like an open hand. Jesus begin with a small talk. Because love doesn't kick the door down. Love knock. Love asks. Love makes space for a guarded heart to open without shame. He is tired. He is thirsty. The eternal Word becomes a man who needs a drink.

Lent is the season that insists we tell the truth about our thirst. Not, "Do I thirst?" The question is, "What am I drinking?" Where do I keep returning, hoping this finally will fill me? What do I keep defending because I don't know who I'd be without it? Why am I still surprised when it doesn't satisfy?

Jesus draws her deeper. Under the blazing noon sun, when shadows can't hide and truth can't run, He reveals God's heart: God thirsts for communion. For closeness. For a real, life-giving relationship. God thirsts that we may thirst for Him. Because God is love, and love longs to be received.

Here is the surprise of the Gospel. God is not waiting for us to fix our lives first. God is already here. Already seeking. Already inviting.

Then Jesus offers her what she never dreamed she could receive. Living water. Not a transaction. Not a reward. A gift.

And this is where the spiritual life changes shape. Grace is not something far away that we chase. It becomes something God plants within us. A wellspring inside the soul. The spiritual life becomes less a treasure hunt and more a remembering and recognition. I am loved. I am held. God has not given up on me. Not even when I have considered giving up on myself.

Because shame doesn't just bruise. Shame isolates. It whispers, *Stay hidden. Stay small. Stay unseen.*

We know that voice. The quiet corner. The lunch eaten alone. The scrolling that numbs the ache. The "I'm fine" we offer when the truth is anything but fine.

The Samaritan woman is a mirror, because we thirst too. For meaning. For belonging. For love. For something strong enough to hold a fragile heart. And Jesus gently reveals our modern wells: approval that evaporates, achievement that always demands more, escape that numbs but never heals, perfection that exhausts more than it protects. And still somehow never satisfies.

But notice what Jesus does. He names her truth **not to shame her, but to free her.** He brings her story into the light because light is where healing happens. Not humiliation. Healing. And then everything shifts. She leaves her jar behind. Because she doesn't need to cling to old ways of getting through. She has met Someone. And that encounter makes her whole and brave. "Come and see," she says.

That's evangelization: **a story of mercy.** Amen my friends.

The world is thirsty. So are we. And Christ is here, at the well, still saying: "Give me a drink" Because He thirsts—**for you.**

The drawing will take place after Mass on **Sunday, April 12th (Divine Mercy Sunday)**, and winners will be notified by phone.






Dear Parishioners,

I wanted to share with you the latest NWEA MAP test results for our parish school. St. Anthony of Padua Catholic School is renewing its academic program to better serve children’s individual needs—intellectually, morally, spiritually, and developmentally. This multi-age model strengthens our Catholic mission, supports excellence through mastery, and reflects our identity as a small, intentional learning community.



Instead of organizing learning by age or grade, students are grouped based on developmental readiness and skill mastery. This approach enables responsive, personalized, and humane instruction.

By emphasizing mastery, this model fosters excellence, providing students with time and support to grasp foundational skills while maintaining appropriate challenge.
