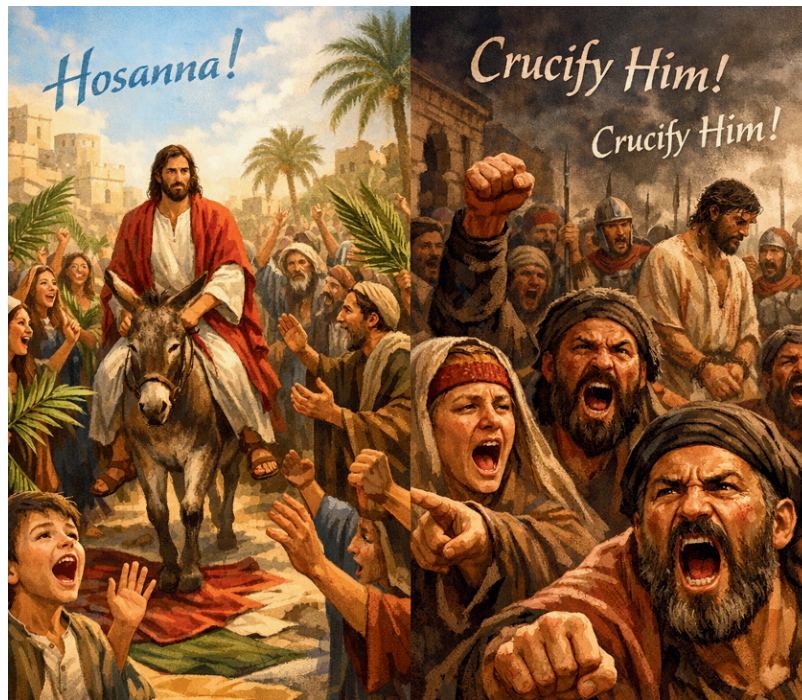

As we begin Holy Week, I invite you to enter these sacred days with your whole heart. From Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday, we walk with Jesus through praise, sacrifice, silence, and resurrection. In these holy days, we are reminded that God meets us in every part of our lives.

Each day this Holy Week, notice when you are pulled toward power, control, image, or self protection. In that moment, choose the way of Jesus: humility, service, vulnerability, and costly love. One moment. One choice. Every day.

FR. EMERSON'S WEEKEND REFLECTION

Praise at the Edge of Betrayal

Palm Sunday is a strange kind of celebration. We come with palms in our hands, singing Hosanna and calling Jesus King, yet from the very beginning we know where he is going. He is moving toward the cross. That is what makes this day so beautiful and so painful.

Palm Sunday is not simply a day of joy. It is praise standing at the edge of betrayal. The crowd is loud, excited, eager to celebrate Jesus before it has truly counted the cost of following him. And that crowd is not only in Jerusalem. It lives in us. We sing on Sunday and struggle to obey on Monday. We say, "Lord, I surrender," until surrender requires something real. We speak of faith until love becomes inconvenient, truth becomes uncomfortable, or forgiveness feels unfair.

There is also something important we often forget. On that day, two processions entered the city. Pilate came from the west with soldiers, banners, and the full display of Roman power. Jesus came from the east riding in humility, welcomed with palms and carrying no weapon but peace. Jerusalem was being confronted with two kinds of kingship. One ruled by force. The other by love.

The crowd cheered for Jesus, but many were drawn to the moment more than to its meaning. They wanted a king, but they had not yet understood what kind of King he was.

Then Jesus does something no one expects. He weeps. While the crowd shouts for a king, the King is crying. He sees what they cannot see. He sees the peace they are missing and the ruin that follows when people fail to recognize the presence of God in their midst.

That is what makes Palm Sunday so sobering. Beneath the sound of celebration is the grief of God. We wave our branches, but he sees our blindness. We praise him in the moment, but he knows how quickly praise can fade into silence and devotion into fear. We want a Messiah who will fix the world. He weeps for the world we refuse to let him change. It is possible to admire Jesus and still not follow him. The crowd admired him. Jesus was looking for faithfulness. He was looking for people who would stay when the music ended, when the crowd thinned, and when the cross came into view.

In the end, many turned away because Jesus refused to be useful on their terms. They wanted visible strength, immediate victory, and a Messiah who would serve their plans and defeat their enemies. But Jesus came in humility. He came in peace. He came not to crush Rome, but to carry a cross. Because he did not meet their expectations, they rejected him.

We are not so different. We want a Jesus who saves us without changing us, a King who comforts us without ruling too closely. But Jesus does not come to fit neatly into our lives. He comes to stand at the center of them. That is why they resisted him then, and why we resist him now.

In Gethsemane, Jesus asks his friends for one simple thing: "Stay with me." They cannot do it. They fall asleep. That reaches uncomfortably close to home. They loved him, yet they still failed him. So do we.

Then comes one of the saddest lines in Scripture: "Peter followed at a distance." Close enough to stay near Jesus, far enough to avoid the cost.

That is the warning of Palm Sunday. Jesus is not looking for admirers in the crowd, but disciples on the road.

So the question is simple. Will we wave from a distance, or will we follow him to the cross?
