This Easter, ask: What among us needs to rise? Who is being left out, judged, ignored, or unloved in our community? And then do one concrete thing: go to that person, speak their name, welcome them, and make room for them at the table.

FR. EMERSON'S WEEKEND REFLECTION

What in Us Is Still Waiting to Rise?

"In the end, everything will be all right. If it is not all right, it is not the end." Those words echo the meaning of Easter. Easter does not deny pain, excuse grief, or pretend everything is fine. It proclaims that darkness does not get the last word, death does not have the final say, and sin and shame are not the end of the story.

That is why Easter feels close to the spirit of Maya Angelou's words: "Still I Rise." Not because life is easy or wounds are unreal, but because grace keeps lifting us when life tries to bury us.

Tonight, our liturgy leads us through the whole human story. We begin in darkness. We hear the story of salvation. We remember Passover, when God's people trusted before they could see where freedom would lead. We pass through sorrow, silence, and loss. And then, slowly, almost unbelievably, we arrive at Easter light.

That journey matters because it reminds us of something we often forget: God does some of his deepest work in the dark.

Maybe that is why Holy Saturday feels so much like real life. Most of us do not live every day in Easter morning. Many of us live in the in-between, between prayer and answer, grief and peace, who we were and who we are becoming.

The good news of this night is that God is present not only in the miracle, but also in the waiting; not only in the breakthrough, but in the silence before it.

And there is more. The Creed tells us that Christ descended to the dead. On Holy Saturday, when the world thought all hope was lost, Jesus entered the deepest darkness. The primitive Church called it the Harrowing of Hell: Christ breaking the gates of death from the inside, reaching even those who thought it was too late.

That means there is no grave he cannot reach, no prison he cannot open, no darkness he will not enter for us.

And resurrection is not simply a happy ending for Jesus. It is the beginning of a new creation. God is not throwing this world away; he is renewing it. Easter is the first light of God's new world breaking into the old.

But here is what Easter people do not always say: when Jesus rises, he still bears his wounds. The nail marks remain. The pierced side remains. The scars remain.

Why does that matter? Because resurrection does not pretend nothing happened. God does not save us by erasing our story, but by redeeming it. The risen Christ is not wounded and defeated, but wounded and victorious.

And that means your wounds are not the end of your story either. By grace, even the places where you have been pierced can become places where light shines through.

So maybe the question tonight is not only, "Jesus is risen, now what?" Maybe it is also: What in me is still waiting to rise? What fear still holds me in the tomb? What shame still keeps the stone sealed? What part of my life have I declared dead that God is not finished with yet?

Because the real test of Easter is not whether we admired it tonight, but whether we will live differently tomorrow.

If Christ is risen, then we cannot keep burying one another under resentment, pride, gossip, exclusion, or indifference. If Christ is risen, then we are called to rise, above fear, above hatred, above everything that keeps love small.

So what does a risen person look like? A risen person forgives, tells the truth, makes room at the table, refuses despair, carries scars without becoming bitter, and brings light into rooms that have grown cold.

So if tonight your life does not yet feel all right, hear the promise again: it is not the end. If you are grieving, it is not the end. If you are healing, it is not the end. If your faith feels weak, it is not the end. If your heart is tired, it is not the end.

Because the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

And so we rise. You will rise. I will rise. We will rise. And even our scars, by the grace of God, will tell not only a story of pain, but a story of resurrection. **Hallelujah. Christ is risen.**
