From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parish Family,

As we draw near to the end of the Easter season, we find ourselves standing at the threshold of a great promise. For fifty days, we have celebrated the Resurrection, but this weekend we prepare for the "engine" that drives our mission forward: the Holy Spirit.

In a special way this weekend, we also honor the mothers and mother-figures of our community. Motherhood is a profound reflection of God's own nurturing heart—a love that, like the Holy Spirit, is a constant, tender presence in our lives. We thank the women of our parish for their sacrifices, their prayers, and the countless ways they mirror the "tender refusal to abandon" that Jesus promises us all.

I would like to personally invite each of you to join us for our **Pentecost Vigil on Saturday, May 23rd**, immediately following the 5:00 PM Vigil Mass.

In the tradition of the early Church, the Vigil is a time of "holy waiting." Just as the Apostles gathered in the Upper Room to await the promised *Paraklētōs*, we will gather to pray for a fresh outpouring of the Spirit upon our St. Anthony community. As we reflected recently, the Spirit is not a remote force, but a presence—the same tenderness and refusal to abandon that we see in Jesus.

This Vigil is our opportunity to stop the "grind" of daily life, quiet the artificial voices, and listen for the true Voice that guides our way.

Discerning a Call: Permanent Diaconate

As we pray for the Spirit to move within our community, we are also looking for men who may be called to the Permanent Diaconate. If you know a man in our parish, **age 35 or older**, who possesses a heart for service and a deep devotion to the Gospel, we would like to know.

CHALLENGE OF THE WEEK

Challenge 1: The Room You've Never Shown Anyone

You have a room. You know exactly which one.
The specific thing. The memory you can't quite shake. The version of yourself you've worked hard to keep offstage.
The grief you've been calling "fine" for so long you almost believe it.
Jesus promised a *Paraklētōs* who walks in without knocking. Who sits down. Who looks at everything and does not flinch.
So here is the challenge. Go inside the room. Sit down in it. And say, simply: Come in. Not to fix it. Just to be here with me.
That's it. That's the whole thing.
Will you let Him see what you have never let anyone else see?
Because the Spirit cannot do through you, what you will not let Him do in you.

Challenge 2: Be the Alter Christus to One Person This Week

One person. Not a cause. A face.
Someone who cannot repay you.
Sit with them. Listen all the way to the bottom. Don't fix. Don't redirect. Don't make it about what you know.
And tell no one. Let it disappear into silence.
Because love that needs to be seen is still performing. And performing is not the same thing as loving.

FR. EMERSON'S WEEKEND REFLECTION

Hey Alexa, Give Me Some Love

Ask most people what religion is, and they'll hand you a rulebook. Jesus handed us a love story: "If you love me, keep my commands."

That word keep—in Greek, *tēreō*—isn't a clerk checking boxes. It's a sentinel who stands in the long dark hours before dawn, eyes fixed on something so precious that he would rather die than see it touched. Not duty. Devotion. Which means the commands of Jesus were never a cage. They were the walls of a treasure. The kind you guard it because you've already surrendered your heart to what lives inside.

Quietly, so quietly we barely noticed, most of us reversed it. We made obedience the engine and love the decoration. We showed up. Checked the boxes. Said the right things. Held the line. And somewhere in all that faithfulness, the warmth leaked out.

When love drains from obedience, the form remains, but the life is gone. Attendance. Hymns. Doctrine. Every ritual still in place, but something essential has slipped behind the scenery.

People on the outside see it. They're watching the engine die. Jesus knew we'd try to carry His mission on willpower and grind ourselves to dust doing it. So He doesn't hand us commands and walk away into the sky. He promises the *Paraklētos*. The one called alongside. Not a supervisor on a cloud. Not a cosmic force to channel. A presence. Someone who steps through the door without knocking, sits with you in the room you've never shown anyone, and does not flinch at what He finds there.

And notice what Jesus calls Him: *allos*. Another of the same kind. Not a substitute. Another Jesus. The same tenderness. The same ache toward the broken. The same refusal to abandon.

So when Jesus says "I will not leave you as orphans," He means it. Especially now. Especially in this stage era where we are most alone precisely when we are most connected. We have artificial voices. We have summoned the digital spirits. Hey Alexa... give me some love. We have fed ourselves with algorithms engineered to stimulate intimacy, and we have gone away hungrier than before. But no one who has the Spirit is alone. Not alone except when it is hardest. Never alone.

The Spirit doesn't carry a message from Jesus. The Spirit is the presence of Jesus, continuing His mission through ordinary lives. Yours. Mine. The quiet ones nobody notices. The fractured ones still limping and trying to find their way back.

Tradition had a phrase for this: *alter Christus*, another Christ. Not an imitation. A continuation. The same love wearing a different face. Yours.

But here's the part we'd rather skip. The Spirit doesn't renovate the old self. He raises a new one. And every resurrection passes through a grave.

If you've already lost more than you ever thought you could survive losing, hear this: He isn't asking more pain of you. It's a promise that the pain already spent was never wasted. The grave you walked through counted. It was real. It was not a detour. And it wasn't the end of the story.

You don't have to be religious to recognize this threshold. Something old has to die before something real can grow. Every honest human being has stood there at least once, usually alone, usually at night, usually without words for what was happening. No shortcut exists through that valley. No way around.

It doesn't need to be otherwise.

What grows on the other side is joy that needs no press release. Hope that can't be marketed. Love that makes no sense at all, unless Christ is truly alive, and truly at work through people who never expected to be used this way. People like the ones reading this sentence right now.

So let love be the engine again. Not a sentiment. A force, the first force that moved over the face of the deep before a single word was spoken into the dark. Let Him move first. Let everything follow. Because when love is the engine, obedience is simply what love looks like when He finally starts to move.

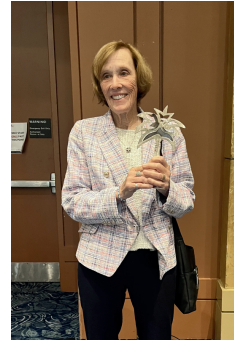

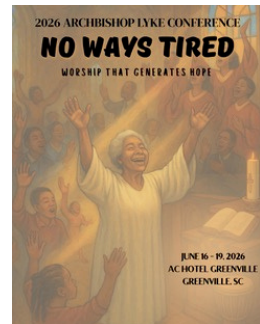

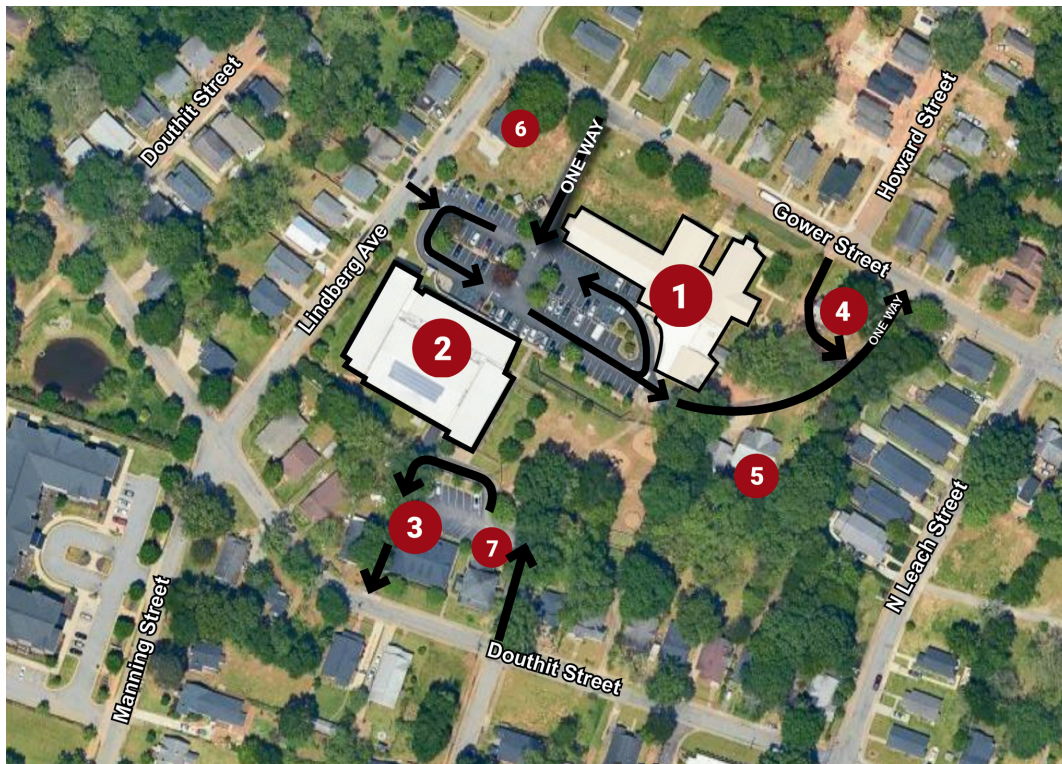
