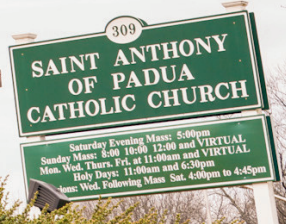




Meet the Pastoral Council
