CHALLENGE OF THE WEEK

Challenge 1: The Hunger Beneath the Hunger

You reach for something every time you feel empty. Your phone. Food. Approval. Busyness. None of it satisfies, because none of it is what you are actually hungry for. This week: The next time you feel that pull, pause before you fill it. Ask one honest question: *What am I really hungry for right now?* Don't solve it. Just name it. Let the honesty become a prayer.

Challenge Two: Become What You Receive

Peter didn't say *I understand now*. He said *Where else would I go?* That is commitment, not comprehension. And it moves outward. This week: Name one person carrying something heavy who will not ask for help. Then do one small thing: show up, stay longer than is comfortable, say less, listen more. Let them know they are not invisible. Not heroism. Just the ordinary arithmetic of the Eucharist: blessed, broken, and given. Not at the altar, but in the actual texture of someone else's life.

FR. EMERSON'S WEEKEND REFLECTION

Come Hungry, Leave Broken Open

How Can This Man Give Us His Flesh to Eat? There is a difference between confusion and scandal. Confusion wants explanation. Scandal asks whether you will stay. Jesus had fed thousands with bread and fish. They followed him, hungry for more. But then He told them something harder: He was the bread itself: "The bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

When they objected, he did not soften the claim. He leaned into it: "My flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink." Many walked away. Then Jesus turned to the Twelve and asked the question that still echoes: "Do you also want to go away?" Peter answered simply: "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." Not, "We understand now." Not, "This finally makes sense." Just: *Where else would we go?* That is faith without pretending certainty.

We all know the hunger that lives beneath every other hunger: the need for meaning, mercy, a love that does not abandon us. We spend our lives trying to satisfy it with achievement, pleasure, approval, control. But none of these can bear the full weight of what we are actually longing for.

Jesus names this hunger plainly: "Do not work for food that perishes, but for the food that endures for eternal life." The Eucharist is Christ saying: your deepest hunger is aimed at me.

In Deuteronomy, God fed Israel with manna in the wilderness. Its purpose was not merely survival, but dependence: "Man does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God." Manna was a sign pointing somewhere beyond itself, a temporary answer to a permanent question.

In John 6, Jesus reveals what manna was always meant: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven." Where manna fed the body for a day, Christ offers himself as the food that endures forever.

Christianity is the faith of the Incarnation. The Word became flesh. And in the Eucharist, Christ gives himself under the signs of bread and wine, ordinary things made extraordinary by his presence. St. Ignatius of Antioch called the Eucharist "the medicine of immortality, the antidote to death." He wrote those words while walking toward his own martyrdom. It was the language of a man who had staked everything on this gift.

The Eucharist makes Christ's love receivable. He feeds us. St. Augustine captured this with startling simplicity: "Be what you see; receive what you are."

St. Paul writes: "We, though many, are one body, for we all partake of the one loaf." This means the Eucharist cannot be separated from how we treat one another. We cannot receive the Body of Christ at the altar and then despise the Body of Christ in the poor, the hungry, the stranger, the lonely, or the difficult person before us.

The Eucharist is not an escape from the wounded world. It is Christ placing his wounded life in us, for the life of the world. The Body of Christ is given to make us more like him: blessed, broken, and given.

The word **Mass** comes from the Latin dismissal: *Ite, missa est. Go. You are sent.* We receive Christ so we may carry Christ into ordinary life. Into work and homes, hospitals and classrooms, grief and conflict and the hidden places of need that no one else sees. The world is hungry, even when it names that hunger differently. Isolation. Despair. Fragmentation. Addiction. Resentment. Beneath all of it is the same question: *Where is the bread that will not perish? Where is the love that will not leave? Where is the life that death cannot take?*

If Christ gives himself to us as bread, we cannot remain closed off. We are called to become bread for others. Think of the friend who stays present through grief when there are no words left and presence is the only gift. These are ordinary people doing what the Eucharist calls all of us to do: offering themselves, broken and given, for the life of the world. This is what it means to be sent. Not to perform heroic acts. To let Christ's self-giving become visible through our small, faithful choices.

Jesus' question still stands: "**Do you also want to go away?**" That question is yours. It is mine. Every time we come to this table, we are answering it again. Come hungry. Leave broken open. Become what you receive.

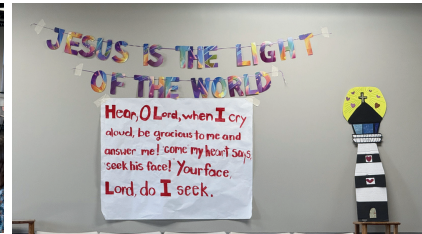

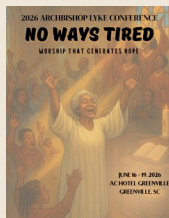

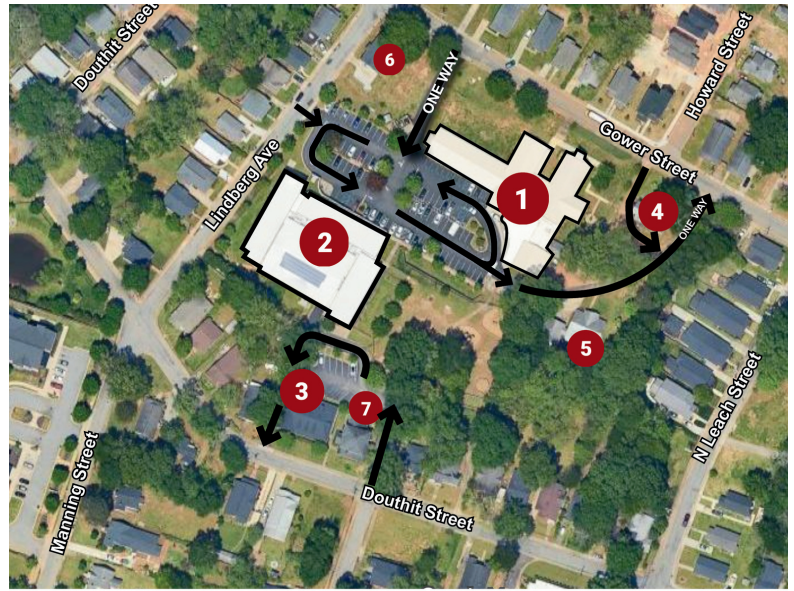
