CHALLENGE OF THE WEEK

Challenge 1: Do Not Pass By

This week, notice one person you might normally overlook. Someone quiet. Someone tired. Someone alone. Someone carrying more than they say.

When you see them, do one small thing: say hello, ask how they are, send a message, sit with them, or simply listen.

You do not have to fix their life. Just do not look away.

Challenge 2: Pray First

Each morning this week, take five minutes to pray before you act. Be honest with God. Tell Him if you are tired, empty, distracted, or unsure. Pray simply: "Lord, I am not enough, but You are. Show me who needs mercy today, and work through me."

Then go through your day with open eyes.

FR. EMERSON'S WEEKEND REFLECTION

Sent While Still Broken

We have all seen someone suffering and wondered what to do. A person sitting alone. A family under pressure. A young person quietly losing hope. Someone carrying pain behind a practiced smile. And if we are honest, sometimes we stop to help. Sometimes we pass by. But Jesus does not pass by.

His compassion moves toward the lost, wounded, and the forgotten. In Him, we see God's mercy walking among us. He does not watch suffering from a distance. He steps into it. His mission is to seek the lost, raise the dead, and bring all creation back to the Father (Lk 19:10; Col 1:19-20). The Gospel tells us that when Jesus saw the crowds, He was moved with compassion because they were "troubled and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd" (Mt 9:36).

Look around. The crowds are still here. People are lonely, confused, abandoned, and quietly searching for something they cannot name. The poor are still not seen.

And beneath so much pain lies a deeper sickness: indifference. The habit of looking away. Still, Jesus does not move on. His compassion becomes action. He heals the sick. He touches those no one else will touch. He feeds the hungry. He searches for the one who is lost.

So the question comes to us: Does our compassion move us to act?

But let us be honest. Some of us hear that question and feel not inspired, but burdened. Maybe you are already tired. Maybe you are the one struggling. Maybe you feel less like a laborer ready to be sent and more like a sheep still longing for a shepherd.

If that is where you are, this is not a rebuke. It is an invitation. Jesus does not call only the strong. He calls the weary. He sends the broken too. His compassion does not wait until we are fully healed before it works through us. It only asks that we stay close to Him, like a tired child staying near a parent, not doing much, simply remaining within reach.

And before Jesus sends His disciples out, He tells them to pray. "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into His harvest (Mt 9:37-38). The mission begins with His strength, not ours. For those who feel empty, prayer is already an act of surrender. It is the admission that we cannot do this alone and were never meant to.

When we bring that weakness to God, He does not turn us away. He restores us. This is who God has always been. Saint Paul writes, "God proves His love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Rm 5:8). Not when we were worthy. While we were still broken. Through Isaiah, God speaks with the tenderness of a mother: "Can a mother forget her child? Even if she should forget, I will never forget you" (Is 49:15).

And now He invites us into that same movement of mercy. Not from perfection, but from gratitude. Jesus tells His disciples, "Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give" (Mt 10:8). We have received mercy we did not earn, forgiveness we could not buy, love we did not deserve. All of it is gift. And the mercy given to us is not meant to stop with us. It is meant to pass from heart to heart, from one wounded person to another.

There is even grace hidden in our struggles. Those who have suffered often recognize suffering more quickly. Those who have been forgotten understand what it means to be remembered. Our wounds, when given to God, do not disqualify us from the mission. They can become the place where His strength is made perfect in our weakness (2 Cor 12:9).

Still, real compassion costs something. It asks for our time, attention, patience. It asks us to forgive when forgiveness is hard, and to love people who are not easy to love. And on the days when we have nothing left to give, the most faithful act may simply be prayer: placing others before God and trusting that He can work through us in ways we cannot see.

But this love, costly as it is, does not leave us empty. It fills us. Jesus said, "Whoever loses his life for my sake will find it" (Mt 16:25). So today, we ask the Lord to make us true laborers in His harvest. Not perfect. But faithful.

May He meet us in our weariness and renew us. May He loosen the grip of indifference. May He open our eyes to the lost, the wounded, and the forgotten. Show us one person we are tempted to pass by, and give us the grace to love them as You have loved us. And remind us, gently and without shame, that He sees us too. Amen.

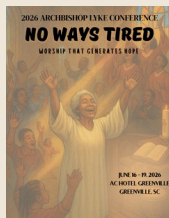

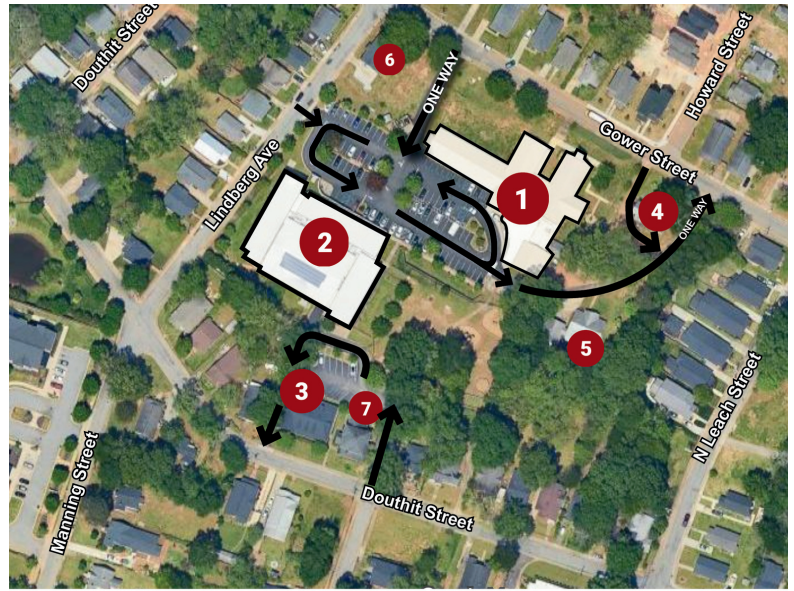
