From the Pastor's Desk

The Universe Is Bewildering, But Grace Is Near

Stephen Hawking spent his life chasing the biggest questions. Time. Black holes. Gravity. The origin of everything. And yet, before a single equation appears in *A Brief History of Time*, he pauses. He looks at the simple fact that we exist at all, and he says something honest and humble: *we live in a bewildering world.*

So we wonder. Why is the world the way it is? Where did we come from? And what, in the end, are we doing here?

At some point, the scientist and the believer find themselves standing in the same doorway. We can measure galaxies. We can split atoms. We can map the entire human genome. Still, something stirs beneath all that knowing. Something no instrument can reach. Both the physicist and the faithful end up whispering into the same dark: What does it all mean?

And sometimes the most honest answers come not from the grandest theories. They come from the smallest, most ordinary things. Dirt. Seed. Open hands.

Jesus once told a story about a farmer, a handful of seeds, and the lavish, indiscriminating love of God.

A farmer went out to sow. If you have ever planted anything, you notice right away that this farmer seems to be doing it wrong.

A careful farmer studies the ground first. He crumbles the soil in his hands. He looks at the sky. He chooses the best place to plant. But this sower? He walks forward with open hands. Seeds fall everywhere. On the path. Among the rocks. Into the thorns. Onto good soil. Not because the sower is careless. Because He is extravagantly generous. And that is the heart of the story in Matthew 13:3-9.

The Sower is God. And this is how God loves.

To cautious eyes, grace can look wasteful. To God, grace simply looks like love. God scatters His Word into every kind of heart. The hardened and the empty heart. The distracted and the deeply wounded. Even the heart that wants to believe but does not know how to begin (Mt 13:18-23).

Sometimes life feels rocky. Dry. Cracked. Packed down with disappointment. Too tired for anything good to grow. You pray and hear only silence. You reach for God and feel only a wall. You try to hope but your heart feels worn out. And it is easy, in those seasons, to wonder: Maybe God is gone. Maybe I have failed. Maybe nothing good can grow here.

But Paul gives us another way to see it. He says that all creation is groaning. The whole world is aching, waiting, reaching for something it cannot yet see. And then Paul gives that groaning a name. Labor pains.

Not the groan of death, but of birth. Not the sound of something ending, but of something pressing its way into life (Rom 8:22-23). Creation is not falling apart. It is longing to be made new. It is being drawn toward healing, hope, and the promise of God.

Labor still hurts. But it is pain with a future. It means something is being born. A seed must be buried before it can rise (Jn 12:24). Soil must be broken before it can bear fruit. And sometimes the soul grows deeper when life presses hard against it. In strain, we learn what truly matters. In loss, our compassion widens. In weakness, we discover that grace was holding us all along (2 Cor 12:9: God's strength is made perfect in weakness).

So the groaning is not always a sign that God has left. Sometimes it is the sound of something being born. Something in you, in our community, something God has promised, something you cannot see yet.

Hawking looked up and called the universe bewildering. Maybe the answer was never in the stars, but in the hand behind them. The hand of the Sower. The one who keeps scattering seeds of grace. Into darkness and light. Into hearts that are ready and hearts that are not. God keeps sowing, trusting that life, in the end, will find its way (Is 55:10-11).

For in the hands of God, no seed of love is ever wasted.

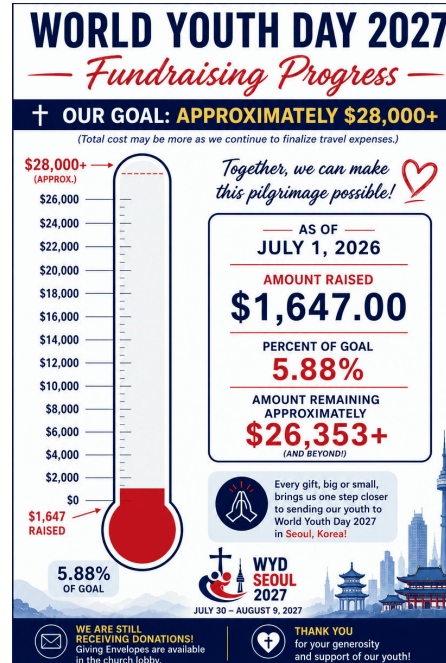

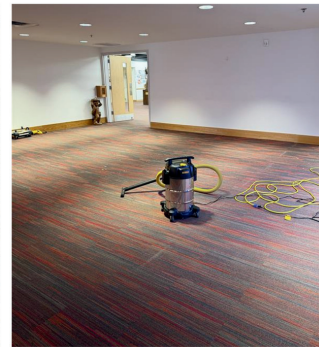
Help Support Our Prison Ministry!

Dear Parishioners,

We are proud to be supporting our faculty through training this summer as they prepare for an even stronger 2026–2027 school year. This year, our teachers are collectively completing 1,800 hours of professional development in mathematics, foundational literacy, English morphology, Latin grammar, catechetical formation, and Catholic curriculum and pedagogy—so that every classroom reflects the mind, heart, and mission of the Church.

As we renew our Catholic educational vision, we are also adopting curriculum and pedagogy deeply rooted in the Church's educational tradition. The Catholic school does more than transmit information: it strives to create “an atmosphere enlivened by the Gospel spirit of freedom and charity” and to help students relate all human culture to “the news of salvation,” so that “the light of faith” illuminates what students learn about the world and about life.

It has been the tradition here at St. Anthony of Padua to publish a school supply list for parishioner donations to help start the new school year. To support the renewal taking place this year, I invite all parishioners to help our school through three Amazon wish lists—one focused on ongoing teacher training, one on school supplies, and one on new curriculum materials.
