FR. EMERSON'S WEEKEND REFLECTION

The Fullness of Empty Hands

Have You Ever Seen a Moving Truck Behind a Hearse? You never will. Yet many of us live as if one were already packed and waiting. We accumulate, achieve, and perform, not simply out of greed, but out of something deeper: a hunger to answer the question that shadows us in every quiet moment: Am I enough?

This is not a new question. Tutankhamun's tomb held more than 5,000 items. Yet no one carries treasure through death's door. No title, no balance, no applause crosses that threshold with us. The answer we are searching for cannot be found in gaining more. It must be remembered. Recovered. Returned to what we were made for.

Jesus understood this restlessness. He names its danger plainly: *"What does it profit a person to gain the whole world and forfeit their soul?"* (Mark 8:36).

He offers two brief and stunning stories about what the kingdom of heaven is like. A man stumbles upon treasure hidden in an ordinary field. A merchant, after a lifetime searching, finds one pearl of surpassing value (Matthew 13:44-46). Both sell everything, not reluctantly, not with grief, but with joy. One found it by accident. The other spent his whole life looking. Yet both recognized the same truth: When something of ultimate value is found, everything else can be released, gladly, freely, fully. When God's kingdom is found, everything changes.

Their stories press a direct question to us: what would make us let go with joy rather than sorrow?

We live in a world that tells us we are what we own, achieve, and display. Descartes said, *"I think, therefore I am."* Our version sounds more like: *I scroll, I buy, I post, therefore I am.*

The problem is not desire itself. Desire can be holy. The trouble begins when we build our lives around the fear of being seen as less: less successful, less worthy, less loved. That fear turns letting go into loss, even when releasing may be the very doorway to freedom and fullness of life.

So what is your pearl? For some, it is security: one more promotion, one more zero in the bank account. For others, it is approval, achievement, or a relationship expected to fill what only God can reach. These are not bad things. But when they become the measure of our worth, they become too heavy to carry and too fragile to hold.

The parables remind us that the kingdom often appears closer than we think. It is hidden in the ordinary ground of our days. In the quiet moment. The unexpected conversation. The familiar field that you have walked a thousand times. Whether you stumble upon it or spend years searching, it waits nearer than you dare to hope.

Christ Himself emptied everything (Philippians 2:7), showing us that true fullness is found not in what we possess, but in what we give away in love. And the empty tomb is the ultimate sign that what we surrender for God is never simply lost. It is transformed.

Saint Augustine once prayed, *"You have made us for Yourself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it rests in You."* That restlessness, the scrolling, the striving, the need to prove ourselves, is not meant to shame us. It is meant to lead us home. Back to the One who alone can fill us where nothing else can reach.

This week, move through your ordinary moments not with fear, but with wonder: *what am I carrying and what would help me let go with joy?*

The moving truck stays behind. But your heart, at last, is full.

This special ministry is designed for children **ages 3 until their First Holy Communion**, offering them a age-appropriate way to hear and understand the Sunday readings.

ACTIVE PARISHIONER

- Weekly attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.
- Volunteer on regular basis (**Time**)
- Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**)
- Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (**Treasure**)

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony must be **registered members for at least six months prior** to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility. For questions, **please contact Mary Corner at mcorner@charlestandiocese.org or 864-233-7717 ext. 2**.

- **Infant Baptism Class:** Active, registered parishioners must call the office to pre-register for classes held on the 3rd Thursday of each month (note: Baptisms are not celebrated during Lent).
- **First Holy Communion:** A two-year preparation program starting in 1st grade; Religious Education registration takes place in August, with classes beginning in late August.
- **Confirmation:** A two-year preparation program starting in 8th grade (registration in August, classes start late August); adults seeking Confirmation should contact the parish office directly.
- **Marriage:** Couples must be active, registered parishioners for at least six months and contact a priest or deacon to begin formal preparation at least six months prior to the wedding.
- **Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA):** The process for non-baptized or non-Catholic adults seeking full communion with the Catholic Church; classes start in September, and interested adults can call the parish office to sign up.

This year, our teachers are collectively completing 1,800 hours of professional development in mathematics, foundational literacy, English morphology, Latin grammar, catechetical formation, and Catholic curriculum and pedagogy—so that every classroom reflects the mind, heart, and mission of the Church.

As we renew our Catholic educational vision, we are also adopting curriculum and pedagogy deeply rooted in the Church's educational tradition. The Catholic school does more than transmit information: it strives to create “an atmosphere enlivened by the Gospel spirit of freedom and charity” and to help students relate all human culture to “the news of salvation,” so that “the light of faith” illuminates what students learn about the world and about life.

It has been the tradition here at St. Anthony of Padua to publish a school supply list for parishioner donations to help start the new school year.
