From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parish Family,

As Catholics, we are incredibly blessed by the Sacraments, most especially the Eucharist and Reconciliation. These sacraments are the lifeblood of our spiritual journey, but they come to us through a very specific channel: the priesthood. Without priests, we do not have the Eucharist.

In the Gospels, Jesus looks out at the crowds and tells His disciples, *"The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest"* (Matthew 9:37-38). Today, the need for holy, dedicated priests, deacons, and religious men and women is as great as it has ever been. God is still calling young people to serve His Church, but in our noisy modern world, it can be difficult for them to hear His voice. They need our prayers to find the courage to say "yes."

That is why I want to highlight a beautiful and vital initiative in our parish: the **Elijah Cup Ministry**.

The purpose of this ministry is simple but profoundly impactful—to unite our parish in intentional, focused prayer for vocations. Each week, an individual or family receives the Elijah Cup at the end of Mass to take home. For that week, the cup is placed in a prominent spot in their home to serve as a daily visual reminder to pause, gather, and pray for an increase in vocations. At the end of the week, the cup is returned to the church to be passed on to the next household.

I strongly encourage you and your family to sign up to take the Elijah Cup home. It is a wonderful way to teach our children the importance of the priesthood and religious life, and it creates a beautiful opportunity for daily family prayer. Even if you live alone, your daily prayers are a powerful spiritual engine for our Church.

Let us boldly ask the Lord to call forth from our own parish community young men and women who are willing to give their lives to Christ and His Church.

FR. EMERSON'S WEEKEND REFLECTION

The Hunger That Leads Us Home

My friends, let me begin with a simple question: What are you hungry for? Not only what your body needs, but what your heart longs for. When your heart feels empty, where do you turn first?

That deeper hunger often appears when life gets quiet, or when everything looks fine on the outside but something inside still feels empty. The Catechism gives that hunger a name: "The desire for God is written in the human heart, because man is created by God and for God; and God never ceases to draw man to himself. Only in God will he find the truth and happiness he never stops searching for" (#27).

That hunger is a sign that we were made for God. Our hearts were made for more than this world can give.

Still, we all know the things we reach for: one more success, one more purchase, one more "like," one more distraction to keep silence away. These things may help for a moment, but they are too small to be God.

The trouble begins when we ask created things to carry what only God can carry. Jeremiah gives us an image for this. God says of His people: "They have forsaken me, the fountain of living water, and hewed out cisterns for themselves, broken cisterns that can hold no water" (2:13).

A broken cistern cannot hold water. That is what happens when we look for lasting life in things that cannot give it. They leak, and they leave us thirsty.

We know this today. We carry little cisterns in our pockets: phones, screens, news, entertainment, and noise. They can help us connect, learn, and rest. But they can also keep us from listening to the deeper hunger within us. They fill the silence for a moment, but they cannot fill the soul.

But God does not leave us thirsty. Isaiah speaks to every restless heart: "Why do you spend your money for that which is not bread, and your labor for that which does not satisfy? Come, everyone who thirsts, come to the waters" (55:1-2).

God does not only call us away from what cannot satisfy. He calls us to Himself. Again and again, He says, "Come to me." This relationship does not remove every sorrow, but it means we do not face sorrow alone. As St. Paul reminds us, nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord (Romans 8:35-39).

That is the invitation Jesus fulfills when He says: "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst" (John 6:35).

We see that same compassion in the multiplication of the loaves. A hungry crowd follows Jesus into a deserted place. He sees them and His heart is moved with pity. Then He tells the disciples, "... give them some food yourselves." (Matthew 13:13-21)
The disciples look at the crowd. Then they look at what they have: five loaves and two fish. It is not enough. But Jesus shows them and us that what feels too little can become enough when it is placed in His hands.

Jesus takes the little they bring, blesses it, breaks it, and gives it. Suddenly, there is more than enough.

That is often how grace works. What feels broken may not be the end. In Christ's hands, even our wounds and limits can become places where grace enters, heals, and is shared.

So, He asks us to bring what we have.

That is what we do when we come to the altar. We do not come because we have everything figured out. We come because we need Him. We bring our hunger, our weakness, our small faith, and our tired and doubting hearts. And Christ receives what we bring. He takes it, blesses it, and gives Himself to us.

So come to the One who knows your hunger and does not turn you away. What are you hungry for? Bring it to Him. He is here to feed you.
