From the Pastor's Desk

Why Your Failures Don't Define You

I woke up wanting to be better than yesterday. By 8 a.m., I'd already failed. Same failure as yesterday. Probably tomorrow too. Sound familiar?

Jesus said the Kingdom is here. Present tense. Already. But look around. Look inside. Does it feel like it? The world is riddled with contradiction. So is the Church. So is your own heart. Faith and doubt. Love and resentment. Hope and despair. If the Kingdom arrived, then why do the weeds still grow?

Jesus knew we'd ask. So instead of a lecture, He gave us a story. A farmer plants good seed. Under cover of night, an enemy sows weeds. When the servants move to rip them out, the farmer stops them: "No. *You'll uproot the wheat with them. Let both grow until the harvest.*"

Here's what most of us overlook. Your greatest strength and your deepest flaw grow from the same soil. The love that drives you to serve? It might be quietly feeding a terror of being unloved, unneeded, unseen. Your zeal for justice? Sometimes it's rage disguise, still nursing an old wound. The devotion that keeps you faithful can curdle into pride and self-righteousness.

So the question turns urgent. How do you tend the wheat without feeding the weeds? Because they are not in separated fields. Their roots are so entangled that pulling one tears the other. That's why they can't simply be torn apart. Turns out spiritual gardening is complicated work.

We assumed faith would go like math. Fewer weeds every year. Steady progress. But even St. Paul confessed: "*The evil I do not want to do, this I keep on doing.*" (Rom 7:19)

Maturity didn't erase his weeds. It made him honest about them. And look at the Twelve. Three years walking beside Jesus, and still there was betrayal, denial, fear, and pride. Same Peter. Same Jesus. Different outcome that night.

We live in an age where one post or one screenshot condemns a whole person. The verdict arrives before understanding even gets its coat on. The parable speaks directly against this. Not to excuse harm, but because in our haste we keep destroying wheat we mistook for weeds. "*Judge nothing before the appointed time.*" (1 Cor 4:5) We are not God. We don't see the whole field. We see a fraction of a stranger and call it their story.

But hear the distinction carefully. Patience with struggle is not tolerance for harm. The harvest belongs to God, but stewardship, discipline, and protection belong to the community. Predators must still be named. Abuse and exploitation are weeds that cannot be left to grow unchecked.

So what does discernment actually look like? It means asking hard questions: Is this person wrestling toward change, or using grace as a hiding place? Does extending patience protect the vulnerable or expose them? Can we hold someone accountable and believe in their capacity to grow? It takes wisdom, not just kindness. It takes courage, not just compassion.

Richard Rohr puts it plainly: "*We do not think ourselves into new ways of living, we live ourselves into new ways of thinking.*" Transformation is not a matter of ripping out the weeds by force of willpower. It is the slow, patient work of living faithfully in the field until the wheat outgrows what surrounds it.

There are wheat and weeds in every field. In the Church. In the world. In your neighbor. And, yes, in your own heart.

That failure at 8 a.m.?
It's a weed with wheat tangled in its roots.

So don't tear yourself up by them. Tend what you can, my friend. Trust God with what you can't.

Be patient with others. Be honest about yourself. The weeds remain, but so does the wheat. And the Farmer, patient, unhurried, knows the difference. The story isn't over, and neither is yours.

We are proud to be supporting our faculty through training this summer as they prepare for an even stronger 2026–2027 school year. This year, our teachers are collectively completing 1,800 hours of professional development in mathematics, foundational literacy, English morphology, Latin grammar, catechetical formation, and Catholic curriculum and pedagogy—so that every classroom reflects the mind, heart, and mission of the Church.

As we renew our Catholic educational vision, we are also adopting curriculum and pedagogy deeply rooted in the Church's educational tradition.
