CHALLENGE OF THE WEEK

Challenge One: Sit in Silence

This week, take 10 minutes to be quiet with God. No phone. No music. Just you.

Ask: "What noise is keeping me from hearing God?"

Don't try to feel anything. Just make room. Breathe. Let God be near.

If the silence feels hard, stay anyway. That may be exactly where He meets you.

A prayer to begin: "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening."

Challenge Two: Name Your Storm

This week, say your storm out loud in one sentence:

"Lord, here is where it's hard."

Then ask: Am I here because I failed or because I was faithful?

Sometimes doing the right thing is what puts us in the wind. And Jesus still sees. Jesus still comes.

When you run out of words, pray what Peter prayed: "Lord, save me."

That's enough. Jesus reaches for us before we go under.

End one day praying slowly: "Take courage. It is I. Do not be afraid."

FR. EMERSON'S WEEKEND REFLECTION

Sinking, Still Moving Toward Him

Last Sunday, Jesus had just learned that John the Baptist was dead. He wanted to go off to a quiet place: to grieve, to pray, to be alone with His Father. But the crowds followed Him. So He set His own sorrow aside and cared for them. This Sunday, He finally gets that quiet. He feeds the crowd, sends them home, tells the disciples to cross the lake, and climbs the mountain alone to pray.

He goes up as a Son who needs His Father. He is tired. He is grieving. Perhaps, in John's death, He already sees the shadow of His own death. Whatever ache you carried in today, Jesus is not far from it. He knows what sorrow feels like.

So the Gospel puts us in two places at once. On the mountain: silence, prayer, communion with the Father. On the lake: darkness, wind, and fear.

And notice where the disciples are. They are exactly where Jesus told them to be. Their obedience is what puts them into the wind. This is hard for anyone who has ever thought: I did what I was supposed to do. Why am I drowning?

There are seasons when following Christ faithfully does not calm the waters. It carries you deeper into them. The call to holiness and mission. The marriage you are fighting to save. The truth of the Gospel you refuse to abandon. The person you keep loving who keeps hurting you. You may not be in the storm because you failed. You may be in the storm because you were faithful.

We usually ask, Do I trust Jesus to save me? The harder question is this: can I trust the One who sent me here in the first place? He did not spare them the storm. But He never took His eyes off them. And at the fourth watch He came, walking on the very waves He had sent them to face.

Picture the scene: it is the fourth watch of the night, between three and six in the morning—the coldest and darkest hours before dawn. The disciples have been rowing for hours, and the lake has grown violent. Only a short time earlier, they had seen Jesus feed thousands with a few loaves and fish. But now, in the darkness, that miracle feels far away.

We know that place. Some storms everyone can see: illness, family pain, division, money worries, conflict, grief. Others stay hidden: anxiety, loneliness, doubt, a weariness we cannot even explain. Some of you have been rowing through the night for a long time. And if you cannot name your storm, if you only know that you are tired, that counts too. The Lord sees what we cannot put into words.

But notice this: the fourth watch is the last watch of the night. Dawn is close. Again and again in Scripture, God comes when His people have reached the end of their strength. At the Red Sea, Israel sees no way forward, and God opens a path. On Easter morning, the women come to the tomb while it is still dark, and the darkness is already giving way.

When we are afraid, we look for God in something dramatic. Elijah did too. He was on a mountain, tired and afraid and ready to give up. A great wind came, but God was not in the wind. An earthquake came, but God was not in the earthquake. Fire came, but God was not in the fire. Then came a tiny whispering sound, and there was God.

That is usually how He comes to us: not to overwhelm us, but to draw us close. Which leaves us a question worth taking home. What noise in my life is keeping me from hearing that quiet voice?

Then, in the middle of the storm, Jesus speaks: "Take courage. It is I. Do not be afraid."

Which means the place you fear most is not a place where God is absent. It may be exactly where Christ is already walking toward you.

Then comes Peter; bold, impulsive, very much like us. "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." Jesus answers with one word: "Come."

For a few steps, Peter walks. He is held up not by his own courage but by Christ's word. Then he notices the wind. He looks at the waves. Fear rises, and he begins to sink.

That happens to us. We begin with trust, and then we look away. The storm starts to look bigger than the Lord, and our faith grows small.

But watch Peter closely: even as he sinks, he is still moving toward Jesus. His faith is weak, but it is reaching in the right direction. So he prays the only prayer he can manage: "Lord, save me." No speech. No perfect words. Just need, honest and urgent. And immediately Jesus reaches out and catches him, not after Peter proves himself, but before he goes under.

When we begin to sink, that prayer is enough: "Lord, save me." Before the words are out of our mouth, the hand that made the sea is already reaching for ours. Take courage. It is He. Do not be afraid.
